Laurier co-op student wins

Honeywell award for 2nd time

Susan Brownrigg of Ottawa, a third-year co-operative education student at Wilfrid Laurier University, has won her second consecutive Honeywell National Scholarship.

And it marks the third time in a row that a Laurier co-op student has won the Honeywell award--open to all university co-op (work-study) students from Canadian universities working at any Honeywell location.

Brownrigg won her second award for the January to April, 1982, work term with Honeywell at Ottawa. The company gave the Laurier student in the school of business and economics the award for "demonstrated outstanding performance and superior accomplishments" during the period of her co-op employment.

She won her first Honeywell award in the May to August, 1981, co-op term, also spent at Ottawa.

The other recent Laurier winner is Pamela Hebert of Waterloo, also a student in the school of business and economics. She spent the September to December, 1981, co-op term at Honeywell Centre in Toronto.
