Projects totalling \$5,400 approved

by Waterloo Lutheran Seminary Auxiliary

Projects totalling \$5,400 were approved when the Women's Auxiliary of Waterloo Lutheran Seminary held its annual meeting all-day Wednesday at St. Luke's Lutheran Church, Kitchener.

A collection taken at the meeting raised \$424 toward the purchase of a banner marking all liturgical seasons to be presented to the seminary, the federated theological college of Wilfrid Laurier University.

Other items included \$510 in gift certificates for graduates of the seminary, \$190 for altar linen for the chapel, \$4,000 to help underwrite the costs of clinical training for students, and a \$200 bursary for Wilfrid Laurier University student. Other sums were set aside to complete purchase of the all-seasons banner and for a working and discretionary fund.

For the first time in many years, delegates met all seven faculty members in the seminary. Each, introduced by Dean Delton Glebe, outlined his background and area of teaching.

It was announced that the seminary has the largest student body in its history this fall--a total of 115 students. Thirteen are women.

Mrs. Dorothy Schaefer, returned for her second term as president, reported that 36 quilts, three thermal blankets and two pairs of pillow-cases had been donated.

Since its founding in 1913 auxiliary members have become famous for the hand-made quilts that adorn every bed in the seminary residences. Several of this year's donations were on display.

In addition to Mrs. Schaefer, executive members returned or elected were Mrs. Isabel Dotzenroth of Kitchener, first vice-president; Mrs. Helen Chapman, second vice-president; Mrs. Eva Hamel, secretary; Mrs. Barbara Romahn, assistant secretary; Mrs. Janice McIntosh, treasurer; and Mrs. Patricia Pond, assistant treasurer.

More than 200 auxiliary members from Lutheran parishes throughout Ontario attended the meeting.
