heads largest campus club

Rose Pulis of Whitby is the new president of the business and economics club, Tamiae, at Wilfrid Laurier University. She is a third-year honors business administration student at the Kitchener-Waterloo university.

She won the top post in a close race with Douglas Airey of London, Ont. She ran on a campaign promising dedication and a commitment to serve the students of the school of business and economics at Laurier well,

As president of the organization with more than 1,000 members, she will play a major role in organizing the academic and social sides of the club, the largest on campus.
