Laurier academic research to be highlight

of WLU annual history teachers conference

Research interests of three members of the history department at wilfrid Laurier University will be featured at the annual meeting for regional high school history teachers April 22.

Between 50 and 60 teachers are expected for the event which will begin at 4 p.m. with two papers given by Douglas Lorimer and Peter Stingelin in the Frank C. Peters Building of the university.

Dr. Lorimer will discuss racism in the Victorian age and Dr. Stingelin will talk about the state of European integration.

After the working sessions there will be a reception, followed by a dinner at 5:30 p.m. in the Paul Martin Centre, with Terry Copp, a third member of the Laurier history department, as keynote speaker.

Copp will give an illustrated lecture on Canadians Who took part in the Second World War invasion of Normandy. The talk was developed out of research for his latest book, Maple Leaf Route:Caen.

Loren Calder of the university's history department is coordinator for the conference, which was planned in conjunction with Region high school history teachers.
