Baptism, eucharist, ministry

topic for Feb. 10 public lecture

Baptism, eucharist and ministry--and the 1982 Lima statement concerning them--will be the topic for the annual Lutheran Life Lecture Feb. 10 in Waterloo.

Dr. William Lazareth, a Lutheran theologian, author and lecturer, will discuss these topics at St. John's Lutheran Church, 22 Willow St., with coffee at 9 a.m. and the lecture beginning at 9:30 a.m. The second half of the lecture will begin at 1:30 p.m. after a luncheon break.

The lectures, sponsored by the Lutheran Life Insurance Society of Canada, are presented by Waterloo Lutheran Seminary each year.

Dr. Lazareth is pastor of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church in Manhattan, and served as professor of systematic theology and dean of faculty at the Philadelphia Lutheran Seminary from 1956 to 1976. He is the author and editor of many publications, articles and reviews dealing with faith, the family and society.

The Lima agreement, reached at Lima, Peru in 1982, is seen as a significant advance in ecumenism since so many major denominations reached a common understanding on baptism, eucharist (the Lord's supper), and ministry.
