Learn computer fundamentals
with student-friendly classes

In this computer age, universities have responded with programs and courses that open careers in this expanding area.

At Wilfrid Laurier University, which offers a bachelor of science degree in computing and computer science, there are a number of courses offered in computing and available to part-time students.

One such course is Business 115, Computer Fundamentals, which will be offered evenings during the six-week intersession, beginning April 30.

The course is an introduction to computers, both hardware and software, and data processing techniques. Special consideration will be given to business applications and managerial implications.

A second course in the same field is Computing Science 113, designed to familiarize students with fundamental computing concepts, such as data types and file handling. The computer language, Fortran, is studied in depth. This course is offered in the spring term, starting May 1 at 7 p.m.
