Law for the business person
offered as part-time course

A course in business law, a practical course designed for those in business, accounting or banking, is among the more than 100 part-time courses available at Wilfrid Laurier University this spring.

Basic legal principles considered most important for people in those areas will be explored in the course. Canadian legal institutions, constitutional law, the law of torts, and real property are among the areas discussed. Another major area emphasized is the law of contract.

Where possible, actual court decisions are studied so the student will be made aware of the judicial approach in dealing with particular problems.

A slightly different approach to law is taken in Philosophy 213. An application of two roles--criminal and victim--and two views of humans--as free agents and as conditioned reactors--will be looked at during the course. The relationship between punishment, restitution and rehabilitation are also studied.

The first course, Business 231, is offered beginning April 20, at 7 p.m. The philosophy course begins April 30 at 7 p.m.
