Laurier's music dean

named to 2nd term

Gordon K. Greene, dean of the faculty of music at Wilfrid Laurier University since 1979, has been named to a second term, of five years, effective May 1.

Dr. Greene came to Laurier in 1978 as professor of music history from the University of Western Ontario, where he had been chairman of the music history department.

A Canadian, Dr. Greene was born in Cardston, Alta., and holds degrees in philosophy and education, in addition to a doctorate in musicology and choral conducting. The doctorate was conferred by Indiana University in 1971.

A continuing priority of the dean will be offering a first-class undergraduate program in music limited to about 200 full-time students and the continuation of the innovative summer programs and workshops that have won wide recognition.
