Toronto, Kitchener receptions
among those planned for authors
of bicentennial atlas

C. Grant Head, the Wilfrid Laurier University's geography professor who is the co-author of a major new atlas, Ontario's History in Maps, will be honored at Queen's Park, Toronto, and in Waterloo in the weeks ahead.

A reception, by invitation only, will be held April 27 in the suite of the Lieutenant-Governor, John Aird, who also is chancellor of Laurier. Premier William Davis will be among those attending.

Then, on May 7 at 3:30 p.m., a reception open to all, will be held in the faculty lounge of Wilfrid Laurier University. The community is invited to meet Dr. Head, examine the atlas, and tour a display of maps in the Concourse Art Gallery.

The gallery display will be open from May 7 to May 11 during regular university hours.

Ontario's History in Maps is the result of more than 10 years of work and research by Head and R. Louis Gentilcore of McMaster University, Hamilton. Gentilcore will attend the reception in Waterloo.

A special volume of the work, published by the University of Toronto Press as part of the Ontario Historical Studies series, will be presented to the Queen when she visits Ontario in June to mark the province's bicentennial.
