Record numbers graduate  
in WLU spring convocation

More than 6,000 parents and friends filled the Kitchener Memorial Auditorium May 27 when a record 960 students received graduate and undergraduate degrees in Wilfrid Laurier University's spring convocation.

Among those receiving degrees were the first graduates in the university's honors science program in computing and computer electronics.

Masters degrees were presented in archaeology, political science, psychology, religion and culture, social work, business administration and divinity.

Undergraduate degrees were presented to students from the faculty of arts and science, school of business and economics, and the faculty of music.

An honorary doctor of laws degree was conferred upon Dr. Norman Wagner, former dean of graduate studies and research at Laurier, and now president of the University of Calgary.

Lieut.-Gov. John Aird, chancellor of the university, presided. Following convocation, graduates and their families attended an out-door reception at the university's campus in Waterloo.
