reach 100% at Laurier

Placements have been found this fall for 100 per cent of business and economics co-op students at Wilfrid Laurier University, Douglas Witmer, director of co-op education reports.

The 101 students, who will enter their fourth and final year of studies in January, will spend the next four months in a variety of placements.

Some returned to the same firms where they spent earlier work terms, and one student will be working with a film house in Hollywood, the first American position for a Laurier co-op student.

Among the firms where the students will be gaining practical experience are IBM Canada, General Motors of Canada, Ontario Hydro, Shell Canada, Home Hardware of St. Jacobs, and the Nova Corporation in Calgary.
