More than 400 receive degrees
at Laurier's fall convocation

Lt.-Gov. John Aird, chancellor of Wilfrid Laurier University, presided Oct. 28 when more than 400 graduate and undergraduate degrees were conferred at Laurier's fall convocation.

An honorary doctor of letters degree was conferred upon Edna Staebler, author of two of Canada's best known literate cook books, *Food That Really Schmecks* and *More Food That Really Schmecks*, both drawing on her earlier articles about the Old Order Mennonites of the Waterloo region.

In Cape Breton Harbour, her 1972 book about the fishing village of Neil's Harbour on the Cabot Trail, she achieved what has been described as one of the finest works of travel literature ever published in Canada.
