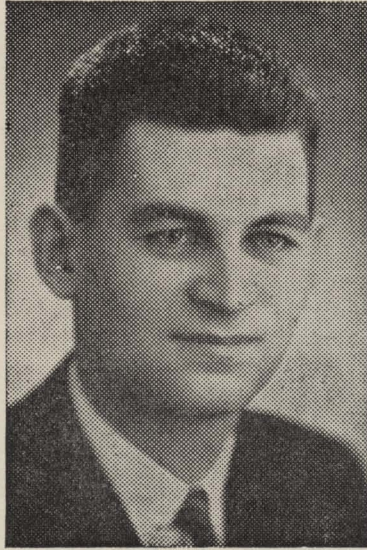

The Rev. U. S. Leupold, Ph.D.,
*Professor of New Testament Theology
and Church Music*

Dr. Leupold is well-known to Lutherans in Canada and the United States as an able theologian and musician. He has published articles on Church Music in Canada, the United States and abroad. He has been in constant demand as lecturer within the conferences of the Evangelical Lutheran Synod of Canada, among young people's groups and music circles.

Dr. Leupold was the Assistant Pastor at St. Matthew's Lutheran Church from 1939-1942. Since 1942 he has served his parish in Maynooth, Ontario, unusually well.

In addition to his duties in the Seminary, Dr. Leupold will serve as Director of Music at Waterloo College. Thus his services are being made available for the student bodies of the College and of the Seminary.

His coming to the Evangelical Lutheran Seminary of Canada and Waterloo College will make his contribution to the work of the whole Church possible to a greater degree.
