100 expected May 9 for

Career Day at Laurier

With planning for a career becoming more important every year, approximately 100 Grade 11, 12 and 13 students from southwestern Ontario High Schools are expected to attend Wilfrid Laurier University's eighth annual Spring Career Exploration Day May 9, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

During the morning session, Peter Soroka, WLU's career advisor and co-ordinator of the Career Day, will lead the students through a variety of exercises designed to help them discover their career related interests.

A panel of university students will share their career exploration experiences and advice. Russell Muncaster, academic vice-president at Laurier, will be the luncheon speaker.

During the afternoon, 20 local occupational representatives will be available to talk to students about such areas as accounting, law, public relations, social work, computing, law enforcement, recreation, investment sales, counselling, marketing, sales, teaching, journalism, personnel and science.

The day is open to all students interested in attending university and not just those considering WLU. "Interested students have been asked to check with their guidance office," Soroka said.

"Making a career choice is one of the two or three most vital choices a person makes," said Soroka. "Students at previous Career Days have really appreciated this opportunity to focus for a whole day on this area."
