All Laurier co-op students
set for January-April term

All 126 third-year business and economics co-op students at Wilfrid Laurier University available for the January-April work term have already obtained jobs.

John Thompson, manager of co-op education for Laurier's school of business and economics, said this was the earliest that all the students had ever found jobs for the four-month work term.

He attributed it to an improving economy and to satisfaction with Laurier students.

Co-op students alternate four months of study on campus with four months of practical experience in the workplace.

Working with the co-op office, the Laurier students found jobs with a wide variety of firms, including General Motors, IBM, Prudential Assurance, Price Waterhouse, and NOVA Corporation of Calgary.
