Adele Wiseman to examine creativity
in public lecture at Laurier Nov. 25

Adele Wiseman, the well-known Canadian novelist, will be at Wilfrid Laurier University next week to discuss her book, *Old Woman at Play*, at a public lecture.

She will discuss the work in relation to creativity, including her own, and will illustrate her talk with dozens of highly unusual dolls made by her 80-year-old mother.

"Who would have thought," she said, "when I set out in the full presumption of my college education to be an artist, that the years of search would bring me, in middle age, to kneel as a small child at my mother's needles."

Her talk, offered without charge, is a presentation of Laurier's departments of English and religion and culture. She will speak Nov. 25 at 8 p.m. in the main auditorium of the university's Frank C. Peters Building, at the corner of University Ave. and Albert St.
