Anne Hall named associate
dean of music at Laurier

Dr. Anne Hall, a member of the music faculty at Wilfrid Laurier University since 1976, has been named the first associate dean: academic of the faculty, for a two-year term.

In announcing the appointment, Dr. Gordon Greene, dean of the faculty, said growth in student enrolment to 230 full-time students this fall has made it necessary to add to the administrative strength of the faculty.

Hall will be responsible for the academic advising of all students, and will assist the dean with course assignments for faculty, organize placement and validating examinations for students, administer the tutorial program, and participate actively in curriculum development, among other duties.

Hall is an associate professor in the faculty, and is director of theory, and also a member of the university's graduate faculty. In 1985, she served a six-month term as acting dean while Greene was on sabbatical.

She was also instrumental in establishing the four-year honors bachelor of music therapy program, the first in Canada.

The new associate dean will continue to teach, with a reduced course load.
