WLU's career fair moves
to largest quarters ever

Wilfrid Laurier University's eighth annual Career Fair will move to quarters three times as large as ever before for this year's fair on Sept. 30.

The event will move from its old home in the Theatre Auditorium to the gymnasium area of the university's athletic building. Construction of the John Aird Centre, which will incorporate the Theatre Auditorium, has made use of the former facility difficult this year.

Jan Basso, director of Career Services, said "It's a perfect time to change since last year we had to turn away 10 employers due to lack of space, and the auditorium was quite crowded."

More than 70 organizations will set up booths in the athletic building in order to provide career information for Laurier students. It will be open to all years, first through graduate studies.

Among the organizations participating are Colgate-Palmolive, CUSO, Ogilvy and Mather advertising agency, and both the federal and provincial public services.

Information for students interested in progressing to graduate school will be provided by Laurier's graduate studies faculty.
