Waterloo executive named

WLU alumnus of the year

Randy McGlynn of Waterloo, a 1972 graduate of Wilfrid Laurier University, is the university's Alumnus-of-the-Year.

Announcement of the award was made when the WLU Alumni Association held its recent Homecoming celebrations. McGlynn is employee benefits consultant for Lackner, McLennan Insurance Inc., Kitchener.

At Laurier, he was a football letterman, and an active member of the alumni association for 10 years who now represents the graduates on the university's board of governors. He is an active volunteer, too, with the Canadian Cancer Society, the Jaycees and the K-W United Appeal.

"The university changed my life," he said, when accepting the honor at the annual meeting of the alumni association. "I've been working since I graduated to pay back what it gave to me and I'll never make it."
