Leading anthropologist
to give lecture at WLU

Dr. Colin Turnbull, visiting professor of anthropology at Vassar College and a graduate of Oxford University, will give the second in the Laurier Lecture Series Oct. 22 at 8 p.m. in Room 1 E1 of the arts building at Wilfrid Laurier University.

His topic is Social change among the hunter gatherers: the Ik and Mbuti peoples of Africa. The talk is offered without charge and is open to all.

Turnbull is the author of 11 books and many articles and monographs on anthropological topics, and is one of five distinguished lecturers who will take part in the Laurier series this academic year.

Turnbull has lectured extensively in North America, Europe,

Africa, Asia and Australia. In 1974 he received the annual award

of the National and American Academies of Arts and Letters for

bringing art and science together.
