Canada's free trade deal with U.S.
to be subject for debate at Laurier

Six faculty members at Wilfrid Laurier University will debate the merits of Canada's free trade agreement in a public forum April 5 from 2 to 3:30 p.m. in the main auditorium of the Frank C. Peters Building, at University Avenue and Albert Street.

The subject: Resolved, that the recently concluded Free Trade Agreement between Canada and the United States will be beneficial to Canada and Canadians.

Speaking for the motion will be Dr. Arnold Frenzel, economics; Dr. Rod Preece, political science; and Dr. Morton Nelson, business.

Those against the motion are Prof. Ralph Blackmore, economics; Dr. Bruce Curtis, sociology and anthropology; and Dr. Thomas Hueglin, political science.

Dr. Alfred Hecht, professor of geography, will be chairperson.
