More than 800 graduate at  
Laurier's spring convocation

More than 800 men and women crossed the stage at Wilfrid Laurier University's spring convocation ceremonies on May 29 to receive graduate or undergraduate degrees.

Degrees were conferred in arts, science, business, economics, music, music therapy and social work; those in divinity, theology and pastoral counselling were granted on behalf of Waterloo Lutheran Seminary, the federated theological college.

A Doctor of Literature, honoris causa, was presented to Dr. Flora Roy, chairman of the university's English department for 30 years.

And Stephen Lewis, now coming to the end of his term as Canada's ambassador to the United Nations, received a Doctor of Laws, honoris causa, and gave a stirring address to those assembled. Lewis expressed his congratulations to the graduates, but encouraged them to make room in their lives for the causes of world hunger, development and peace.

A reception for graduates and their families, hosted by Dr. John A. Weir, Laurier's president, followed the ceremonies.
