PART-TIME STUDENTS AT LAURIER HAVE WIDE CHOICE OF COURSES

More than 150 different credit courses for part-time students will be offered this fall and winter by Wilfrid Laurier University. Some of them will be offered as distance education courses available over Rogers Cable and TVOntario while many other courses are available in a classroom setting.

Here are some of the courses to be offered:

\*Peoples of Africa: A televideo course offering a survey of African cultures. The approach is comparative, and the focus is on pre-contract cultural patterns.

\*Small Business Management: This course is designed to assist the present and potential owners of small businesses with the start-up and ongoing management of a profitable, small firm.

\*Canadian Society and Culture: An exploration of the many dimensions of Canadian society -- the characteristics, issues, problems and potentials of the nation.

\*Human Communication Processes: Basic theory in an interactive mode with reference to such topics as perception, motives, nonverbal communication and the breakdowns in the communication process.

\*Canadian Fiction in English: Canadian life and imagination explored in significant works by such writers as Atwood, Laurence, Watson and Ross.

\*Business French: This course is designed for students in business and reviews the fundamentals of the French language, both oral and written.

\*History of Canadian Federal Politics: Canadian political leadership from 1867 to the present.

\*Basic Materials in Music Theory: An introduction to music notation, terminology and concepts of music theory, ear training and sight-singing.

\*Quest for World Peace: A televideo course inquiring into the causes and possible cures for international violence. It focuses on the threat of nuclear war.

\*Love and Its Myths: An inquiry into the methodologies and relationships, with a discussion of such themes as marriage, sexuality, attraction, friendship, fellowship and fidelity.

\*Social Services in Canada: Canadian social services under public and private auspices. Examined will be the nation's capability of meeting social service requirements with emphasis on the range of services available for health care, child welfare, mental health, the aged and women.

More information about these and other courses is available by telephoning the office of part-time studies at Laurier 884-1970 ext. 2447. Fees are \$167 for a half credit course and \$324 for a full credit course. Those who are 60 years of age and over may take courses without paying the fees.
