Raffi Cavoukian

T is with great delight that we gather today to honour Raffi Cavoukian, a world-renowned children's advocate, musician, author and lecturer.

Known fondly by millions of young fans, parents and educators by his first name, Raffi, Mr. Cavoukian began his career as a Toronto-based performer in the 1970s. Over three decades Raffi became a muchbeloved children's troubadour and advocate for issues affecting children internationally.

Of Armenian descent, Raffi Cavoukian was born in Cairo, Egypt where he spent his early childhood before immigrating to Canada in 1958 with his family. In the 1970s, he accepted an invitation to sing for children in Toronto schools. Raffi was a huge hit with young audiences, offering music as a vehicle for young children to express themselves. While his work has been described in its constituent elements as musician, advocate and author, it is very clear that he is a consummate teacher and educator in a broad, communitarian sense.

Raffi's songs are internationally beloved. Songs such as "Baby Beluga," "All I Really Need," and "Bananaphone" are favourites of children, parents and educators. Through melody and lyric, Raffi is able to tap into a core principle of childhood education — the value of creativity and expression.

Mr. Cavoukian established his own company, Troubadour Music, to ensure that his music was produced to his high ethical standards. Out of respect for his young audience, he has refused all commercial endorsement offers and his company has never advertised directly nor marketed to children.

In recent years, Raffi developed a holistic philosophy called Child Honouring, a practical vision for addressing the universal needs of all children. His "Covenant for Honouring Children" outlines several child-honouring principles such as the right of children to live free of commercial exploitation. In 2009, he founded the non-profit Centre for Child Honouring on Salt Spring Island, an educational hub that advances Child Honouring as a universal ethic.

Raffi's appeal is multi-generational; he connects with adults who grew up with his music as children in the 1970s and 1980s, inviting them to become active in effecting change. His work is also associated with several non-governmental organizations including the Council of Human Development.

Raffi's work in the linked areas of child advocacy, education and music is exemplary of Laurier's commitment to excellence linking local and global contexts and in education that contributes to communities and individuals. Raffi has demonstrated the impact that a single individual with commitment, passion and determination can make on society. Significantly, too, Raffi's life experience demonstrates the positive value of individuals from diverse cultural contexts towards the development of contemporary Canadian society.



Today Wilfrid Laurier University honours Dr. Neil Arya for his commitment to the improvement of the health of individuals and populations, both locally and globally, through various educational, curricular, clinical, research, advocacy and other related programs and projects.

Dr. Arya is Founder and Director of the Kitchener-Waterloo Refugee Health Clinic in collaboration with the Kitchener-Waterloo Reception Centre where he provides case-specific care to newcomers and those in need of specialized care. He also helped develop the Psychiatric Outreach Project, providing mental health care to the homeless and at risk in Kitchener. Dr. Arya's humanitarian health work earned him the 2009 College of Family Physicians of Canada Geeta Gupta Award for Equity and Diversity.

He was also awarded the 1998 YMCA Peace Medallion for his devotion and contribution to the functioning and operation of various health-promoting groups as President of Physicians for Global Survival and Vice-President of International Physicians for the Prevention of Nuclear War, which won the 1985 Nobel Peace Prize. He has taught Peace through Health in Peace Studies at McMaster University and the University of Waterloo and co-edited a book on the subject.

He is a family physician at the Kitchener-Waterloo Centre for Family Medicine, where he and his colleagues were awarded the Family Practice of the Year in 2008 by the Ontario College of Family Physicians for outstanding community medical service. As a member of this Family Medicine Teaching Centre, a satellite campus of McMaster University, he has held an Assistant Clinical Professorship at McMaster University and an Adjunct Professorship at the University of Western Ontario in Family Medicine. As an Adjunct Professor at the University of Waterloo in Environment and Resource Studies, and also in Health Studies and Gerontology, he has taught courses on Global Health and Ecosystem Health.

His work and educational promotion concerning marginalized populations also includes numerous presentations, research, development of protocols, and medical student training. Dr. Arya has been committed to advancing awareness, understanding and knowledge of global health, eco health, and peace through health issues, both locally and abroad through his various teaching roles and contributions to curriculum expansion and development. His teaching earned him a 2006-2007 University of Western Ontario USC Teaching Honour Role Award of Excellence.

Dr. Arya is the Founding Director of the Office of Global Health, University of Western Ontario. The office coordinates activities and educational initiatives that have a global-health nature, including relevant components involving marginalized populations and communities as well as international research and education.

Some of Dr. Arya's specified elective sites, projects, and regions of partnership include Guatemala, El Salvador, Israel/Palestine, East Africa (Kenya, Tanzania), India, and China.

Not only has he shared his knowledge and expertise locally, but on an international scale and through numerous publications, presentations, lectures and meetings across the world on topics such as Peace through Health, Nuclear Weapons and Small Arms, Public Health, War, Conflict and Health, and Marginalized Populations.

Dr. Arya has also contributed to the promotion and inspiration of socially responsible leaders to promote and enhance health outcomes for all individuals and populations through his mentorship, teaching, lectures and his written academic and non-academic contributions.

Laurier is fortunate to have him as a partner and friend.

LAURIER'S HISTORY AT A GLANCE 1911–1953

- The official opening and dedication of Waterloo Lutheran Seminary took place on October 30, 1911. The service began at 2:00 p.m. at St. John's Church before a congregation of approximately 1,500 people.
- The Women's Auxiliary of Waterloo Lutheran Seminary was founded on February 27, 1913 to increase interest in the programs and needs of the Seminary.
- In 1914, Rev. Nils Willison became the first graduate of the Seminary. Willison later became a professor of Waterloo College and was a member of the Board of Governors of Waterloo College and Seminary for 12 years. Today, Wilfrid Laurier University's Willison Hall is named in his honour.
- In 1924, the Faculty of Arts was established and Waterloo College was created. A three-year Arts course was offered and the fourth year was outlined. After registration day on September 17, 1924, the first class consisted of 24 students.
- On February 18, 1925, Waterloo College affiliated with the University of Western Ontario to offer degrees to its graduates.
- In 1926, the first issue of the *Waterloo College Cord* was published. Now named *The Cord*, the weekly newspaper is produced by a team of over 70 volunteers and an editorial staff of 15.
- In 1928, the original Seagram Memorial Field was opened behind Willison Hall.
- The Board of Governors made the decision to admit female students to Waterloo College in spring 1929.
- In 1931, Louise Kathleen Twietmeyer became the first female student to graduate from Waterloo College. She graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree and went on to become an instructor of English and French at Waterloo College. She later completed her master's degree at the University of Western Ontario.
- Enrolment increased to 55 students in 1931, from 35 the previous year.
- In 1950, the first annual Boar's Head Dinner took place. Today, the Boar's Head Dinner is organized by the Wilfrid Laurier University Students' Union. Students celebrate the last day of fall classes with a feast, a silent auction and live entertainment.
- The first *Keystone* yearbook was published in 1950. Prior to its launch, Waterloo College received a few pages in the University of Western Ontario's yearbook, *Occidentalia*.
- The first Homecoming took place in 1953. Today, the Homecoming tradition continues once a year for three days. Thousands of students and alumni show their Laurier spirit by attending a variety of activities, including a football game, a pancake breakfast and class reunions.

A rthur Carty has had an astonishingly successful career as a researcher and teacher, academic leader and administrator, advisor to governments, and champion of science and technology.

Dr. Carty was educated where he was born, in northern England. After completing a PhD in Inorganic Chemistry at the University of Nottingham, he set out for Canada, landing a job at Memorial University. Two years later he arrived at the very young University of Waterloo.Many of his successes have occurred here in our city.

From the beginning of his research career, Dr. Carty's record has been impressive. To date, he has contributed over 300 journal publications and secured five patents, primarily in the fields of organometallic chemistry and new materials. His colleagues have recognized his achievements as a chemist: he has been President of the Canadian Society for Chemistry and received many awards and honours specifically for his contributions as a chemist. He also excelled at teaching chemistry, and has a long record of supervision, from undergraduate to doctoral students, as well as post-doctoral fellows.

His success as a researcher is matched by his success as an administrator. He was a two-term chair of his department, and then founding director of the innovative Guelph-Waterloo Centre for Graduate Work in Chemistry, the first of many inter-university collaborative programs in the region. His academic leadership was rewarded with a term as the University of Waterloo's first Dean of Research.

In 1994, he left Waterloo for new challenges, becoming President of the National Research Council of Canada, and remaining in that position for ten years. He then spent four years as Canada's first national science advisor – to the prime minister and to the government. It was during this time in Ottawa that he began to achieve renown for his ability to create and develop organizations dedicated to supporting research and innovation. For example, in 1999 he was founding Board Chair of Canadian Light Source, the Saskatoon-based national synchrotron research facility. Other Canadian research- and technology-oriented organizations in his record include Atomic Energy Control Board, Canadian Space Agency, Genome Canada, MITACS and the Stroke Network.

Dr. Carty returned to Waterloo in May 2008 to become founding Executive Director of the Waterloo Institute for Nanotechnology. His leadership, and his ability to harness researchers, industry, and government, have established this institute as a hub for leading-edge research in an interdisciplinary field that is, and will remain, a source of new ideas and amazing devices.Complementing his role in the institute, he is involved with many collaborative organizations aiming to develop nanoproducts.

Another aspect of his work is to advise on international science and technology collaboration. His experience attending G8 meetings of science ministers and science advisors led to a position as Canadian co-chair of the Joint Science and Technology Cooperation Committee of the Canada-India science and technology agreement. His extensive international connections include continuing ties to India, Japan, and Taiwan.

Dr. Arthur Carty has not only originated important ideas, he has counselled others on how to foster innovation, and played a major role in the establishment and development of many Canadian research enterprises, where important innovations are conceived and developed to fruition. In all of his endeavours, he has demonstrated excellence, and therefore has earned our recognition.

- The first issue of the Waterlooan was published in 1954. The Waterlooan was a magazine geared towards alumni of Waterloo College. It only lasted one issue, but then resurfaced in 1957 as This is Waterloo. From 1962 to 1974, the magazine was known as Waterloo Campus. Since 1974, it has been called Laurier Campus.
- In 1959, the Associate Faculties applied to the Provincial Legislature for a University charter. The request was approved, and the Associated Faculties became the University of Waterloo. The President of Waterloo College, J.G. Hagey, left to become the founding President of the University of Waterloo.
- The Evangelical Lutheran Seminary of Canada applied for a revision of its charter in 1959. This revision was granted, which changed the corporate title to Waterloo Lutheran University and allowed degree-granting rights to both the Waterloo Lutheran Seminary and Waterloo University College.
- On June 30, 1960, Waterloo College's affiliation with the University of Western Ontario was terminated. During the 35-year affiliation, over 1,000 Waterloo College graduates received their degrees from the University of Western Ontario.
- On July 1, 1960, Waterloo Lutheran University began its first year as a degree-granting institution.
- In 1960, a full-time honours business program began. The first eight degrees were conferred in May 1962, and the Department of Business Administration and Economics was officially formed in 1966. Today, with over 4,500 students, 120 full-time faculty and 80 part-time faculty, the Laurier School of Business and Economics is one of the largest business schools in Canada.
- The first annual Winter Carnival took place in 1960. It was established as a way of rejuvenating students' school spirit after the December holiday. Winter Carnival has become a tradition, celebrating its 50th anniversary in 2010. Almost 750 students divided into 21 teams participated in the 50th Winter Carnival, setting a new record.
- In 1961, the students of Waterloo Lutheran University began the annual Shinerama fundraiser during Frosh Week (also known as Orientation Week). More than 400 freshmen took to the streets to shine shoes and raise money for a local residence for children with mental and physical disabilities. In 1978, Laurier's Shinerama program affiliated with the Canadian Cystic Fibrosis Foundation. Since then, Laurier students have raised more than \$2 million for cystic fibrosis research.
- The Council of Graduate Studies in Arts was launched in 1965. Emily Dolbeer was granted the first Master of Social Work degree in 1968.
- In 1965, the University granted its 1,000th degree, to Margaret Ann Elash. She also received the first Bachelor of Science degree.

Louise Arbour

Me. Louise Arbour is a most distinguished Canadian, an eminent jurist on both the Canadian and the international stage, and one of the world's foremost advocates for human rights. Born and raised in Quebec, Mme. Arbour graduated from the College Regina Assumpta in Montreal in 1967, and from the Faculty of Law of the University of Montreal in 1970. From the beginning of her legal career, she pioneered the integration of women into the highest levels of the Canadian legal profession, as a clerk for Supreme Court of Canada Justice Louis-Philippe Pigeon in 1971-72, and as a professor at Osgoode Hall Law School from 1974to 1987, when she became a member of the Supreme Court of Ontario and later a member of the Court of Appeal for Ontario.

In 1996 Mme. Arbour was appointed chief prosecutor for the International Criminal Tribunals for Yugoslavia and Rwanda. Among her notable achievements in this role was her indictment of Slobodan Milosevic, then-president of Yugoslavia, for war crimes in 1999. This was the first time a sitting head of state was prosecuted for war crimes. Mme. Arbour was also instrumental in having rape and sexual violence designated as crimes against humanity.

Mme. Arbour left her position as chief prosecutor in 1999 to become a member of the Supreme Court of Canada. Here she continued in her pioneering role as an advocate for human rights, for example in her minority position arguing that on the basis of international human rights law, schools and parents could not use physical force to discipline children. She also joined the majority in a decision preventing deportation of two Canadians to the United States, where they might face the death penalty.

In 2004 Mme. Arbour accepted the position of United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights. In this role she increased the commission's presence worldwide, and was influential in the reform of the United Nations Human Rights Commission and its transformation into the present Human Rights Council. She also raised the profile of economic human rights, insisting that poverty is one of the worst threats to human dignity.

Mme. Arbour's legal decisions and international career have not been without controversy, but she is recognized nationally and internationally for her extraordinary commitment to human rights, her legal brilliance, her diplomatic and political skills, and her courage in defending victims of human rights abuses. Since 2009, she has been president of the International Crisis Group, a non-governmental organization whose purpose is to prevent and resolve deadly conflicts. She is also an advisor to, or member of, too many organizations to mention, and the recipient of countless international and national awards, including being named a Companion of the Order of Canada.



- The Faculty of Social Work was established in 1966.
- In 1973, Waterloo Lutheran University received its new charter as the provincially funded Wilfrid Laurier University.
- In 1974, Wilfrid Laurier University introduced co-operative education. The undergraduate Business program was the first to offer the co-op option. Today, the co-op option is offered to all Arts, Science and Business programs, including three master's programs.
- On January 17 1974, Radio Lutheran became Radio Laurier.
- On May 1, 1975, Music became its own faculty. Later that year, the Faculty of Graduate Studies was also formed.
- In 1983, the first issue of *The Laureate*, an internal newspaper for staff and faculty, was published. It was published until 1992, when the name changed to *Laurier News*, which remained until 2002. It was revived in 2008 and renamed *insideLaurier*.
- In 1999, Laurier's Brantford Campus opened with 40 students and two faculty members. Today, the campus is home to more than 2,500 students.
- The Faculty of Science became a stand-alone faculty at Laurier in 2000. It has grown to seven departments and in 2003 it began offering its first PhD program.
- Laurier's Lyle S. Hallman Faculty of Social Work formally opened its new Kitchener facility and commemorated the Faculty's 40th anniversary at celebration events held on Thursday, September 28, 2006. Laurier received a heritage award for outstanding achievement in refurbishing the original 1907 building, which had been home to St. Jerome's high school.
- In 2007, an office in China was opened. The office is based at Chongqing University and promotes academic collaboration, research partnerships and faculty and student exchanges.
- In 2007, the Faculty of Education opened.
- In 2009, the Toronto Office opened. The office is located on the main floor of the Exchange Tower, and serves the many alumni and co-op students who live and work in Toronto. It also helps deliver innovative programs, such as Laurier's weekend-format MBA.
- In 2010, Laurier became a founding academic partner of the Communitech Hub in downtown Kitchener. The Hub is a digital media and business-accelerator centre that brings start-up entrepreneurs together with successful high-tech companies and academic leaders in a collaborative environment.

In the spring of 1969, the Royal Military College in Kingston, Ontario called to convocation the son of a Canadian member of the Royal 22e Regiment and a Dutch nursing student. Roméo Dallaire was to receive a Bachelor of Science degree. As have our graduates today, he earned the right to his life's aspirations through fierce determination and conviction in his calling.

Forty-two years later, Wilfrid Laurier University pays tribute to Lieutenant General, the Right Honourable Roméo Dallaire, Officer of the Order of Canada, Grand Officer of the National Order of Quebec, Officer of the American Legion of Merit, Commander of the Order of Military Merit., and Honorary Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada. His account of the Rwandan genocide of 1994, Shake Hands with the Devil, earned the 2004 Governor General's Literary Award for Non-fiction. We are not alone in our respect and admiration.

We honour General Dallaire today on two counts: the enormous burden that he shouldered as commander of the United Nations Assistance Mission in Rwanda in 1993-94, and what he has made of his life subsequently.

Canada's Nobel Peace Laureate, Lester Pearson, wrote in a 1956 address to Princeton University:

"... to every challenge given by the threat of death and destruction, there has always been the response from free men: It shall not be. By these responses man has not only saved himself, but has ensured his future."

In the charnel house he describes in Shake Hands with the Devil, it surely must have seemed to General Dallaire that free men and women had broken faith with this ideal: standing against evil in defence of the rights of all men, women and children. Professional soldiers, who by temperament and training suppress violence and restore order, were commanded to stand down. Roméo Dallaire and a handful of military and volunteer medical personnel were made to bear witness to the systematic brutalization and mass murder of more than 800,000 Rwandans. Neither blind, nor deaf, they lived the horrors of modern genocide that most of us only encounter in 30-second video reports on the nightly news.

General Dallaire returned home, to his family and work, reduced in mind and spirit. The corrosive effects of so much human depravity and suffering left General Dallaire and many of his comrades in the grip of post-traumatic stress disorder. It eventually ended the career that had been so central to the young Dallaire's aspirations. But it did not vanquish determination, fortitude, and conviction.

Today, Senator Dallaire is a powerful spokeperson for the rights and rehabilitation of child soldiers, for the principles and purpose of the Responsibility to Protect, for the men and women of our military who return from war only to endure the agony of post-traumatic stress disorder. He is a beacon of the best about Canada.

In our midst are men and women destined to do the work from which most of us would shrink. They bear witness, they survive, and by force of goodness and will they become guides of our collective conscience. We owe them the trappings of honor and respect. But more than these, we owe them care and kindness. They stand for us, carrying the intentions of our better selves at great personal cost. Their purpose inspires, their lives ennoble. Today we salute such a person.





Today we honour two young Canadians whose work and vision exemplify Laurier's mission and core principles. For over 15 years Craig and Marc Kielburger have challenged individuals "to become engaged and aware citizens of an increasingly complex world" in ways that emphasize "innovation, civic engagement, global citizenship, sustainability, and justice." Those Laurier ideals could have been written for the Kielburgers. By welcoming these two self-described "shameless idealists" into the Laurier community, we expect that their "contagious passion for social change," as they love to call it, will not only reflect but leaven our community's own commitment to global engagement and social justice.

Craig Kielburger was only 12 when a newspaper headline about the murder of a child his own age in Pakistan caught his attention. The year was 1995, and this stark introduction to the realities of global child labour led him to start a local children's rights advocacy group called Free the Children. Over time, Free the Children would become, in Craig's words, "the world's largest network of children helping children through education. Through the organization's youth-driven approach, more than one million young people have been involved in innovative programs in more than 45 countries."

Craig's older brother Marc co-founded Free the Children. As both nurtured this organization, learning from others on their travels across the world, they pursued university degrees. Craig earned an executive MBA from York University's Schulich School of Business. Marc completed a degree in International Relations from Harvard, then earned his law degree on a Rhodes Scholarship to Oxford University, where he specialized in human rights law. They also co-authored several books, including: Take Action! A Guide to Active Citizenship (2002); the bestselling Me to We: Finding Meaning in a Material World (2004); and The World Needs Your Kid: Raising Children who Care and Contribute (2010). The Kielburgers are recipients of many honours, including the Order of Canada.

There is more. In 2007 Craig and Marc Kielburger created an event called We Day intended to generate a year-long program of action to celebrate the power of young people to create positive change. Since then, youth from across North America have come together for several We Day events to discover the passion they have in common, celebrate their successes, become aware of new challenges, and build lasting friendships. These events feature speeches and performances from global leaders and social activists, cultural icons and entertainers. Kitchener-Waterloo hosted its first We Day this past November.

In 2008 the Kielburger brothers established a social enterprise called Me to We, which Marc now directs. Me to We sells socially conscious and environmentally friendly clothes, books and music, with the intent of transforming consumers into world changers, one transaction at a time.

Children remain at the centre of their work, both at home and abroad. So too does their passion for positive change, including thinking that challenges individuals to care, contribute and be compassionate.

Laurier is delighted to award honorary Doctor of Laws degrees to both Craig and Marc Kielburger.



Today Wilfrid Laurier University recognizes Ms. Linda Hasenfratz, a uniquely talented businessperson, philanthropist and mother.

The most critical of business analysts have described Linda Hasenfratz as one of the most talented business people in Canada and, indeed, around the world.

Ms. Hasenfratz is Chief Executive Officer of Linamar Corporation. Founded by her father, Frank Hasenfratz, Linamar is a Guelph-based global success story that manufactures components for the automotive industry.

After graduating with a Bachelor of Science degree in Chemistry from the University of Western Ontario, the independent-minded Ms. Hasenfratz felt the family business was not her thing, so she spent nine months selling pharmaceutical products in Toronto. She later had a change of heart and returned home to join her father's company.

Her father had seen many businesses fail after being handed down to unprepared family members. So, instead of walking straight into head office, Linda started out on a carefully planned eight-year apprenticeship.

She began her 20-year career at Linamar in safety boots on the shop floor. From there, she worked in nearly every department in the company, providing her with a lifelong focus on the importance of quality and consistency in production and of the critical role that people play in the manufacturing process.

Named President in 1999 and CEO in 2002, Ms. Hasenfratz has significantly expanded Linamar's footprint in Europe and marched into Asia. She has diversified the Linamar product line and invested millions in R&D to help put Linamar components into the most cutting-edge engines on the market, as well as into wind turbines and solar dishes.

Remarkably, she accomplished all this during the worst decade in automotive history, one that drove two of Linamar's biggest customers, General Motors and Chrysler, into bankruptcy and forced many suppliers to close their doors.

Ms. Hasenfratz has more than doubled the size of the Linamar empire, which now encompasses 37 manufacturing facilities in eight countries, including Mexico, Hungary, Germany and the United Kingdom, plus 11 sales centres and five R&D shops.

Moreover, she exemplifies the leadership traits that we at the Laurier School of Business & Economics seek to instill in our students – aggressive corporate growth and astute financial management balanced by a strong belief in corporate social responsibility and employee well-being.

But if all this makes it sound as if Linda is just a businessperson, it would not be the whole story.

Linda Hasenfratz is an active volunteer in numerous areas, serving as Vice-Chair of the Royal Ontario Museum Foundation; as a member of the Canadian advisory board of Catalyst, an international non-profit organization working to expand opportunities for women and business; and as a member of the prestigious North American Competitiveness Council.

She has received awards and honours too numerous to mention, but of note was her inclusion in Canada's prestigious Top 40 under 40 listing.

Linda Hasenfratz is most notably a proud mother of four children and a wonderful role model for the young men and women graduating today.

Michael Pryse

It is with great respect and admiration that we recognize Bishop Michael J. Pryse for a lifetime of outstanding ministry and service to the wider community. As an ordained leader in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada, Bishop Pryse has provided distinguished leadership in a wide range of public, ecumenical, and multi-faith arenas. On October 31, 1959, a date commemorating the beginning of Luther's Reformation, Michael Pryse was born in Toronto, Ontario and subsequently placed for adoption. In 1961 he was adopted and moved to Kitchener, Ontario where he completed his primary and elementary education. He attended Eastwood Collegiate and then Wilfrid Laurier University where he earned a Bachelor of Arts degree, majoring in History and English. He subsequently enrolled in Waterloo Lutheran Seminary, graduating in 1985 with a Master of Divinity degree and earning a Graduate Gold Medal for Academic Excellence.

Following his ordination on June 7, 1985, he served as pastor in Mildmay-Neustadt and Burlington, Ontario and as an assistant to the Bishop. He has been a member of the ELCIC National Church Council and the Board of Directors of Canadian Lutheran World Relief. In 1998 he was elected to serve as Bishop of the Eastern Synod, one of youngest pastors in North America to ever be elected to this office.

Bishop Pryse is fervently committed to the cause of Christian unity and is a strong advocate for increased ecumenical and multi-faith co-operation. He has co-chaired the Joint Anglican Lutheran Commission since 2001. Bishop Pryse's grandfather, a Baptist clergyman who emigrated from the United Kingdom in 1930 and did much of his ministry among the Six Nations peoples in Canada, was a formative influence in his life. In 1965, in recognition of his work among the Six Nations peoples, Bishop Pryse's grandfather was inducted into the Cayuga band and given the name Haw we nye so wane, which translates in English as Big Heart. This example, and his experience of being adopted by a loving family, has fueled Bishop Pryse's desire to break down the walls that divide members of the human family.

Following the events of September 11, 2001, Bishop Pryse was one of the first church leaders to express solidarity with Muslim leaders in the face of the hurtful interpretations of Islam that were used as justification for the terrorist attacks. He has initiated numerous dialogues with Lutheran clergy and Muslim and Jewish leaders. He has travelled extensively in many parts of the world on church delegations to strengthen development partnerships that address basic human rights in places such as India, Bangladesh, El Salvador, and the Holy Land, to mention only a few. He supports the public responsibility of the churches and has actively addressed issues of global justice, human rights, international development and issues related to the full inclusivity of all people.

Bishop Michael Pryse leads the Eastern Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada, which established Waterloo Seminary in 1911 and Waterloo College in 1925, and which became Waterloo Lutheran University in 1959 and Wilfrid Laurier University in 1973. WLU, or Laurier as it is more commonly referred to now, is a symbol of the traditional Lutheran commitment to academic inquiry and accessible student-centred higher education. Waterloo Lutheran Seminary continues as an educational institution of the Eastern Synod and a federated college of Laurier. Conferring an honorary doctorate is a most fitting way to recognize the contribution of a distinguished religious leader who embodies the values of this university and the continuing shared mission of two fine academic institutions in inspiring lives of leadership and purpose.

THE CEREMONY

Convocation Traditions

Convocation is the most solemn ceremony within the university community. Since their beginnings in the Middle Ages, universities have performed this ceremony in order to grant degrees to their students and also to welcome those students into the community of scholars which has trained them.

The conferring of the degree is symbolized either by an acknowledgement or handshake from the Chancellor or the President or other conferring officers of the university.

As an outward sign of his or her new state, the student wears a hood. Each degree within a university has a hood of unique colours and trim in order that the student's status may be recognized—indeed every university guards its own set of hoods from use by any other university.

In order to recognize the nature of this event for the students involved, the university asks that parents and friends of the students participating in this ceremony withhold their applause until all members being admitted to each degree have left the dais. Students are asked to remain in their seats while other graduates receive their degrees.

The Academic Degrees

The academic degree is a title conferred on an individual by a university as recognition of the completion of a course of study or for a certain attainment. In Canada, the three stages in higher education are represented by the degrees of bachelor, master and doctor. Wilfrid Laurier University is given the authority to grant degrees by the Wilfrid Laurier University Act.

The bachelor's degree is awarded at the honours and general level. An honours degree program emphasizes the acquisition of a broad and deep knowledge of the student's chosen honours subject, including both skill at applying the subject and appreciation of its relation to general knowledge and society. A general degree program emphasizes a balance between an in-depth understanding of the student's major subject and a knowledge and appreciation of other fields. Completion of an honours degree normally takes four years and a general degree, three years.

The master's degree is the second degree in higher education. Students complete concentrated and specialized work at a more advanced level in an academic discipline or professional area. Most course work is within the field of specialization and a research project or thesis is normally required. Some master's degrees provide professional qualifications. The master's degree usually requires one or two years of study after a bachelor's degree.

The doctoral degree is the highest academic degree granted by a university. Candidates for the degree spend several years in the advanced study of a specialized field of knowledge. The capstone of the degree is the doctoral dissertation, an extended work based upon independent research. The dissertation demonstrates the candidate's command of both the subject matter and the exacting methods of scholarship, and makes an original contribution to knowledge.

Honorary Degrees

Honorary degrees are conferred by Wilfrid Laurier University in recognition of outstanding scholarly, creative, or professional achievement or distinguished public and community service. The university may grant the following honorary degrees: Doctor of Laws (LLD), Doctor of Letters (DLitt), Doctor of Science (DSc) and Doctor of Divinity (DDiv).

Wilfrid Laurier University Mace

The mace of Wilfrid Laurier University was officially presented by the Euler family at the 1963 fall convocation in memory of The Honourable W.D. Euler, former senator of Canada and the first chancellor of the university. It weighs 16 pounds and was manufactured by the firm of Henry Birks Limited, Montreal.

The ferrule near the base of the shaft contains ivory from a walrus tusk obtained from Coral Harbour, Northwest Territories. The ten-sided shaft, representing the ten provinces, merges into the head of the mace which bears the ten provincial crests. The wood used at the point where the shaft meets the head of the mace is elm taken from the bannister post of Conrad Hall, the original seminary building. Above this are four crests relating to the history of the institution: a crest of Waterloo County, the Luther Coat of Arms, the crest of the Waterloo Lutheran Seminary and the coat of arms of the University of Western Ontario.

The head of the mace is made of maple and bears the Federal Coat of Arms, above which is the monogram of Queen Elizabeth II, during whose reign the university's charter was granted. On the reverse side is the crest of Wilfrid Laurier University and the monogram of King George V, during whose reign the original charter was granted. The top of the mace is a crown, mounted with jewels, symbolizing the authority of the State.

The Marshal's Baton

Dr. Fred Binding, a faculty member in the Department of Psychology for 32 years retired in July 2003. He had served as the university marshal for ten years. Sadly, Dr. Binding died in August 2003. In memory of his contribution to convocation ceremonies, artist Rex Lingwood was commissioned to create a marshal's baton.

In the baton, the artist incorporates a range of visual references that relate to the graduation ceremony, both directly and symbolically. In keeping with the nature of the ceremony, some of the forms are traditionally associated with ceremonial staffs, and the baton's design echoes the elaborate theatricality of the event and the flair brought to the occasion by Dr. Fred Binding. The ends may be read as abstracted figure forms wrapped in the academic gown and hood, with details in the university colours: purple and gold. These forms also read as plant buds, symbolizing the life stage of the graduates. The Greek alphabet is inset into an internal side surface in the shaft of the baton. This is a reference to the interests of Dr. Fred Binding. It also acknowledges that language is at the core of university education and that the Greek language has particular importance in western culture.

The commission of the baton was made possible with the generous support of the Department of Psychology and Wilfrid Laurier University Retirees' Association.

Wilfrid Laurier University Alumni Association

More than 74,000 graduates of Wilfrid Laurier University and its predecessors are the members of the Wilfrid Laurier University Alumni Association (WLUAA). The WLUAA, a volunteer driven, non-profit organization, is the official body representing Laurier alumni. The elected Board of Directors is representative of all academic faculties and many different decades.

The WLUAA supports Wilfrid Laurier University with revenue from alumni services, such as group home, auto and life insurance, an affinity credit card and financial services. WLUAA revenues help to fund alumni programs, university projects, student groups, scholarships, homecoming and Laurier Campus, the alumni magazine.

To foster alumni interaction with the university and alumni communities; to promote active alumni participation in the affairs of the university; to maintain and promote the reputation of the university and contribute to its ongoing development.
