Cambridge residents win scholarships at Wilfrid Laurier University

Waterloo, Ont. (*Feb. 15*) — Three Cambridge residents have distinguished themselves by winning scholarships at Wilfrid Laurier University in Waterloo. Dushan Filo, Katherine Rochester, and Heather Kerr will be honored at an awards ceremony on campus on Tuesday, Feb. 15.

Filo, a 1991 graduate of Monsignor E. A. Doyle Secondary School and now in the third year of the honors history program, will be presented with the Dwinnelle-Steffler Scholarship. The \$300 award recognizes the top student entering the third year of the honors history program.

Filo is the 22-year-old son of Anton and Mira Filo of Christopher Drive in Cambridge.

Rochester, who is in the second year of the honors music program, will receive the Spae-Naur Performance Award. The \$750 award is presented to a student who has a good academic record and who shows outstanding talent in the performance of classical music. Rochester lives on Rich Avenue.

Heather Kerr, now in the second year of the master of social work program at Laurier, will receive the McMillan Scholarship. The \$1,850 scholarship is presented to a student in good standing in all course work and in field placement. Selection is also based on a brief essay identifying the major ethical or moral dilemmas facing the social work profession.

Kerr earned a bachelor of arts degree in law and psychology from Carleton University in 1986 after graduating from Port Hope high school in 1983. She is the daughter of John and Gwen Kerr of McCall Street in Port Hope.
