## **WLU research centre offers trade seminar for novice exporters**

Waterloo (Sept. 24) — The opportunities for and challenges of exporting to the United States and the Pacific Rim will be the focus of a trade seminar for novice exporters at Wilfrid Laurier University on Friday, Oct. 2.

Featured speakers at the event, organized by the Laurier Trade Development Centre, will be Maria Bernard, a Canadian government trade commissioner in Los Angeles, and C.S. Lee, a commercial officer with the Canadian embassy in Seoul.

The formal part of the program will begin at 8:30 a.m. and conclude at 11:30 a.m. Following a lunch break, participants will be able to consult with Canadian trade officials concerning export market development.
