22nd annual Easton-McCarney program features award-winning film

Waterloo, Ont. (Oct. 23) - Ladybird, Ladybird, a recent British film that chronicles a young mother's struggle with a social welfare system that questions her ability as a parent, will be the feature presentation at this year's Easton-McCarney Memorial Fund program on Nov. 1.

The film, which was inspired by a true story, won the 1994 Berlin Film Festival's International Critics Award and the Best Actress prize, as well as the 1994 Chicago Film Festival's Best Actress award.

Ladybird, Ladybird will be shown at the Princess Cinema, 7 Princess St., Waterloo, on Wednesday, Nov. 1, at 6:30. It will be introduced by Piers Handling, director of the Toronto International Film Festival, and will be followed by refreshments and a panel discussion. Admission is free, but donations will be asked for at the door.

The Easton-McCarney Memorial Fund was established in 1974 to honor John Easton and Christopher McCarney, students at Laurier's Faculty of Social Work who were killed in a car accident in December, 1972.
