Discover Laurier program eases transition to university life

WATERLOO, Ontario — The university experience is more than just the pursuit of knowledge. It's also about new friends, a new city, and of course, independence.

Discover Laurier, a weekend program for new students enrolled at Wilfrid Laurier University, introduces first-year students and their parents to some of the challenges of university life and helps make the transition from high school to university a smooth one.

Beginning **Friday**, **July 25**, **1997** and **concluding Sunday**, **July** 27, 1997, students and parents will attend lectures, workshops and information sessions that focus on a variety of topics including academic choices, career options and personal finance. Campus tours, seminars and social events are also part of the program.

Laurier's new president, Dr. Robert Rosehart, will address participants at an assembly on **Saturday, July 26 in the Theatre Auditorium beginning at 11 a.m.** Also scheduled to speak are Dr. Arthur Read, dean, faculty of arts and science; David McMurray, dean of students, and Stewart Wong, president of the Wilfrid Laurier Students' Association. Dr. Tupper Cawsey of the School of Business and Economics will deliver the keynote address.

"Discover Laurier attempts to bring the entire university experience to new students," Joel Lynn, the event's co-ordinator says. "The program we have developed addresses both the academic and student-life aspects of attending university. It also helps to answer questions that students and parents have about undergraduate studies, and provides an opportunity for students to get to know the campus and each other before studies begin in September."
