Laurier building re-named to honor prominent Dundas physician

A five-storey building that has been the heart of teaching at Wilfrid Laurier University for almost three decades received a new name today.

The building, known as the Central Teaching Building since it was opened in October, 1970, is now known as the Dr. Alvin Woods Building.

The re-naming of the building to honor Dr. Woods comes at the request of his son and daughter, Ron Woods and Audrey Cruickshanks, and follows their generous donation to Campaign Laurier, Wilfrid Laurier University's \$15 million capital campaign.

Ron Woods, president and chief executive officer of Health One Inc., a developer of medical and dental clinics, is a 1963 graduate of WLU.

Dr. Alvin Woods, who died in 1991, was a medical practitioner in Dundas for many years. He was also Medical Officer of Health and Coroner in Dundas, as well as medical director of Wentworth Lodge and St. Joseph's Villa, also in Dundas.
