## **University to showcase campus talent at 19<sup>th</sup> Laurier Art Show**

WATERLOO – The Robert Langen Gallery will again showcase the talents of on-campus artists during the 19<sup>th</sup> annual Laurier Art Show. The Gallery will host an opening reception at 4 p.m. on Wednesday, March 22, to introduce this year's display of artwork created by faculty, staff and students.

The exhibition, which runs from March 21 to April 1, offers budding Laurier artists an opportunity to display their work in a non-juried show. As in previous years, this exhibition will include paintings, sculptures, stained glass, photography and mixed-media works. It will also include works in textiles, such as quilts and knitting.

"We had a great turnout last year and this year is shaping up to be better still," said Gallery curator Suzanne Luke. "I'm particularly excited about the textile work, which is something new this year."

The show is an open call, which allows any interested member of the Laurier community to enter a work. Some of the art is for sale by the artists. Previous exhibitions have included pieces by artists who later rose to prominence, including Marshall Ward.

Members of the public can view the exhibition, free of charge, by visiting the Gallery in Laurier's John Aird Centre. The Gallery is open between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. from Tuesdays to Fridays, and between noon and 5 p.m. on Saturdays.
