WATERLOO – The Robert Langen Gallery will host an exhibition of original etchings and serigraphs titled *Along the Path: A selection of original prints from 1971-2000* from September 5 to 23. The public can meet artist Sheila Maki at a reception in the gallery on Wednesday, September 13, from 4 to 5 p.m.

Maki's original prints reflect her personal thoughts and the determination she has created in her studio over the past 30 years. The prints come from groups of editions and, when studied chronologically, show the artist's progression of ideas, her growth and the development of artistic technique.

"This exhibit involves a constantly evolving path in my artwork that has taken almost 30 years. It has been a trip with many variations, developments and obstacles," says Maki. "This trip has cast a long shadow of light in my life through my art."

Raised in North Bay, Maki studied with well-known artists throughout Canada and at the Camden Arts Centre in London, England. Her works have appeared in exhibitions throughout Canada, the United States, Europe, Korea, Japan, Hong Kong and Brazil.

As Wilfrid Laurier University's visual arts centre since 1989, the Robert Langen Gallery provides knowledge, stewardship, appreciation and enjoyment of Canadian art and culture to the local community. The gallery is located in the John Aird Centre and is open 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. from Tuesday to Friday and 12 to 5 p.m. on Saturdays. Admission is free.
