Elementary students jump ahead to university with Laurier JUMP Multidisciplinary program offers hundreds of students a taste of university life

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WATERLOO – Close to 1,900 elementary school students will spend two or three days sampling university life as Laurier hosts its annual Junior University Multidisciplinary Preparation program. JUMP encourages young students to pursue higher education by exposing them to university courses, residence and campus life.

Between May 7 and June 20, students in grades six, seven and eight will participate in a series of two- or three-day programs, featuring interactive courses taught by Laurier professors, senior students and graduate students. They'll choose from a list of courses that includes archaeology, athletics, biology, business, chemistry, fine arts, mathematics, music, political science, psychology, social work and theatre.

"We've found that exposing young students to several aspects of the university encourages them to consider higher education later on," says Michelle Jokic, JUMP co-ordinator. "They learn about academics, but also gain a little independence, meet students from other schools and develop the skills needed to make decisions that will shape their academic careers."

JUMP also includes a university-life and careers-choice seminar designed to help students address any concerns they have about university, and to develop the skills and attributes necessary for post-secondary education. And the students will experience other aspects of campus life by living in residence and eating in campus hangouts.

Most students attend seven classes from the list of 12, as well as the university-life and career-choices seminar. They also tour campus, live in Willison Hall residence and eat in the dining hall. The visit ends with evaluations and a graduation lunch where students receive diplomas from the JUMP program.

This year, Laurier is also introducing a two-day version of JUMP in order to offer the experience to more schools. This program provides the academic and student-life aspect of the JUMP program.

Created in 1994 with six participating schools, JUMP expands year after year as many schools return and new ones learn of the program. This year's program includes 64 classes from 40 different schools. A list of the schools participating this year is attached.
