Artist uses maps to understand others in Paths We Have Taken

WATERLOO – The Robert Langen Art Gallery will host an opening reception for an exhibition of paintings, entitled Paths We Have Taken, from 4 to 5 p.m. on Wednesday, March 1. Elora artist Phil Irish will be on hand to discuss his work, which is on display from March 1 to 25.

The exhibition is inspired by maps Irish has asked people to draw, leading to places that have special significance to the cartographer. The maps lead Irish to places with strong associations, where decisions were made or solace sought – places the cartographer returns to again and again. Irish follows each map, gathering photographs, drawings and notes.

From the records of his own experience in the place, he then produces an oil painting based on his subjective response to the cartographer's experiences. The oil painting and the original map are exhibited as a single piece of art.

"This project partakes in the community-building act of really trying to understand another person," said Irish. "This series of work reflects a marvelous diversity of locations and voices within a community."

Irish has been selected as the City of Kitchener's next artist-in-residence and will continue to collect maps throughout 2006. To learn more about Irish's work and awards, please visit www.philirish.com.
