Binding Memorial lecturer to focus on home-field advantage in sports

WATERLOO – A world-renowned authority on group dynamics in sports will discuss the impact of home advantage in sport competitions at this year's Dr. Fred Binding Memorial Lecture at Wilfrid Laurier University.

Dr. Albert Carron of the University of Western Ontario's School of Kinesiology will deliver the lecture in Laurier's Senate and Board Chamber on Monday, March 26, starting at 7:30 p.m.

Dr. Carron's research focuses on group dynamics in sport teams and exercise groups. His work has led to a number of awards, including the Sport Science Award of the International Olympic Committee President for outstanding research contributions to the sport sciences.

"Teams often feel they have a better chance of winning when playing on their home turf," said Jill Tracey, assistant professor of kinesiology and physical education at Laurier and organizer of the lecture. "Dr. Carron has completed significant research on the home advantage in competitions and how it affects players on both teams."
