WATERLOO — Laurier School of Business and Economics student Christopher Carmichael will be in Ottawa May 5 and 6 as one of only six competitors from across the country vying for the national Wes Nicol Entrepreneurial Award.

Carmichael's business, Campus Ink, offers students in post-secondary schools low-cost printing solutions such as ink cartridge refills and remanufactured ink cartridges. A second-year business student, Carmichael competed in the Laurier Entrepreneurship Challenge and the Nicol LaunchPad \$50K competition to earn a shot at the national Wes Nicol Entrepreneurial Award.

"Laurier is well known for producing students with innovative business ideas. It's not just about what we teach them but how they apply their learning in the real world as well," said Steve Farlow, executive director of Laurier's Schlegel Centre for Entrepreneurship.
