WATERLOO – The first graduating class of Laurier's Master of Social Work program will return to the university October 25-26 to celebrate their 40th anniversary.

Members of the class of 1968 will join former faculty members, including former dean Dr. Frank Turner, for a reunion at the Faculty of Social Work's new home in the old St. Jerome's high school building at 120 Duke St. W. in Kitchener.
