Laurier to graduate 2,250 students at its 2009 spring convocation

WATERLOO – Wilfrid Laurier University will be holding its spring convocation ceremonies June 3 to 10.

As of June 2, approximately 2,250 students had met all program requirements and qualified to graduate. Laurier expects to confer 222 graduate degrees, 2,003 undergraduate degrees and 25 diplomas. On average, 80 percent of Laurier graduands attend convocation ceremonies. Laurier will hold six ceremonies in Waterloo and two at Laurier Brantford.

"Convocation is a moment of great pride for our whole community as we celebrate the academic success of our students," said university registrar Ray Darling. "Many of our students will treasure this milestone for years to come."
