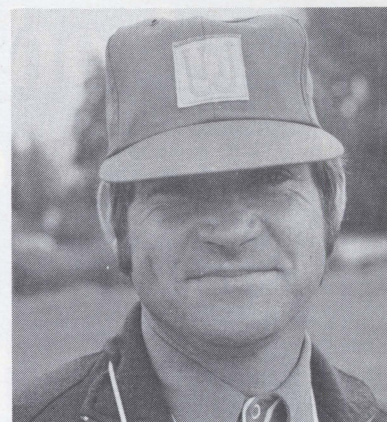


Golden Hawks Coaches



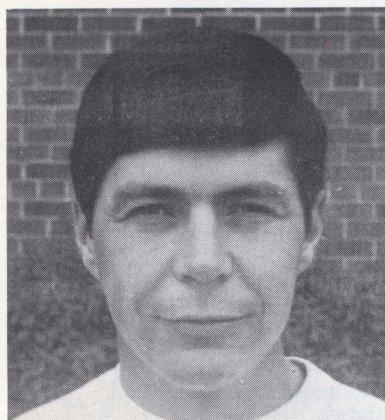
Coach Dave "Tuffy" Knight - Head Coach

Coach Knight, a native of Clarksburg, West Virginia, has been with the Golden Hawks for eight years after coaching for a number of years in Ohio. During this time Tuffy has lead the Hawks to the National Finals three times, including 1972, at which time he was honoured as "Canadian Football Coach of the Year". As well as coaching, Dave is the Director of Athletics for the University.



Coach E. "Rich" Newbrough - Backfield Coach

Coach Newbrough played football for Fairmount State University in West Virginia, where he was the quarterback. After coaching in Ohio for two years, he came to the "Golden Hawks" in 1968, and since has coached on two championship Golden Hawk teams. In other areas Rich is the Associate Director of Athletics in charge of intramural, recreation and facilities in the Athletic Complex.



Coach Don Smith - Scout

Coach Smith is a native of Crooksville, Ohio. He came to WLU in 1970 after coaching football and basketball in Ohio. Although he is the Head Basketball Coach he is assisting with football.

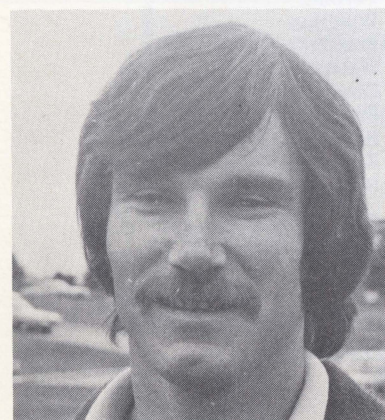


Coach Gary Jeffries - Assistant Line Coach

After being a former All Star defensive back for the Hawks in 1970, Gary was drafted by the Argos in 1972 and resigned by the Tiger Cats in 1973. However, Gary decided to become Intramural Coordinator and help coach the Hawks.

Coach Roger Passmore - Asst. Backfield Coach

Roger played three years of varsity football for the Hawks until graduating in 1970 at which time he was drafted by the Saskatchewan Rough Riders. In 1972 he received his Master of Science degree in physical education from the University of Michigan.



Coach Peter Robinson - Asst. Backfield Coach

Coach Robinson received his Bachelor of Science degree from University of Toronto and his Masters from Arizona State. Peter has 13 years coaching experience at high school and university levels and is presently Athletic Director at Guelph Collegiate. Coach Robinson coached the All Ontario Rugger Championship Team 1974.

The 1973-74 football season found the W.L.U. "Golden Hawks" capture their second consecutive Yates Cup, emblematic of the Ontario Championship and also a second appearance at the Atlantic Bowl in Halifax.

As in the past the Canadian Football League recognized the fine calibre of football found at W.L.U. and as a result 15 players were offered professional contracts. This is a very impressive feat and illustrates the type of talent found at W.L.U. Of these drafted four have found a home in the C.F.L. They are — Rick Konopka, Larry Uteck, Larry Simpson and Doug Smith.

Rick Konopka, 6'3" 230 lbs. Defensive End with the Toronto Argos has had a very successful start in the C.F.L.

Larry Uteck, 6' 195 lbs. Defensive Back is also with the Argos. As well as starting at the defensive back, Larry is also returning kicks with another former Hawk, Wayne Allison. Larry is presently one of the top returners in the C.F.L.

Larry Simpson, 6'4" 230 lbs. Tight End, is also with the Argonauts. Larry has seen limited action this season but has shown great ability during his appearances.

Doug Smith, 6'1" 235 lbs., Centre with Montreal Alouettes. Doug has seen quite a bit of action thus far this season and has shown he is capable of playing with the pros.
