## Laurier hosts Canadian Political Science Association conference May 16-18

WATERLOO – More than 600 political scientists from Canada and around the world will gather at Wilfrid Laurier University May 16-18 to discuss a wide range of topics, from the recent federal election to Canada's role in Afghanistan, as part of the 2011 national conference of the Canadian Political Science Association.

The conference will feature a variety of engaging formats for participants and journalists, including roundtable discussions, keynote speakers and the presentation of academic papers.

"With over 600 delegates from across Canada as well as from the United States, United Kingdom, Australia, Europe and China, the 2011 Meetings of the Canadian Political Science Association will address a wide range of important and timely issues, including May's federal election, the recent international financial crisis and Canada's role in Afghanistan," said Laurier professor and programme chair Debora VanNijnatten. "The conference will also feature more than 20 plenary and keynote speakers across the 13 sub-fields of political science, including lectures on political participation, climate justice and women and political leadership."

• *Global Governance of Agriculture and Food I.* Papers and discussion, Tuesday, May 17, 8:45 a.m. to 10:15 a.m.; and *Global Governance of Agriculture and Food II*, 10:30 a.m. to 12 p.m.

• *Election 2011: Perspectives on the Campaign and Outcome*. Roundtable discussion Wednesday, May 18, 3:15 p.m. to 4:45 p.m. featuring William Cross of Carleton University, Barry Kay of Wilfrid Laurier University, Anna Esselment of the University of Waterloo, Frédérick Bastien of Laval University, and Joe Garcea of the University of Saskatchewan.
