When Should I Arrive?


Monday, September 1st is our traditional "move-in" day. If you are moving into residence and/or have purchased a full Orientation Package from the WLU Students' Union (see details on the next page) this is the best day for you to arrive. When you arrive on campus you will be directed to the Athletic Complex.

If you are not living in residence and not participating in the Students' Union orientation program, come whenever you like. Take note of the special academic sessions, University welcoming events, educational workshops, and special group orientation days, highlighted in this brochure, to plan your week.

Monday, September 1st is the main registration day for both residence registration and the Students' Union Orientation Program. From 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., staff are available to get you settled into your new home. You may want to bring your copy of your room assignment sheet just in case! Once you get into the main registration area, follow the signs.

Each building has senior students working as your residence staff. They will introduce you to residence life and guide you through your first-year experience.

Living Off Campus

If you are not living on campus, but have paid to participate in the Students' Union Orientation Program, you should arrive on Monday, September 1st as well. You can pick up your Students' Union Orientation Package from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. in the Athletic Complex. If you arrive after 3 p.m., go directly to the Students' Union offices located on the 3rd Floor of the Students' Union building. All week long we will have a special Off-Campus Headquarters. The TV Lounge on the 3rd Floor of the Students' Union Building will be your meeting area, hang-out place, message centre, and much more. Make our Off-Cam Headquarters your home away from home for Orientation Week! Our Foot Patrol program will assist with your safe return home following evening events. Call them for a walk home at 886-FOOT or look for their Drive Home program throughout O-Week.

Academic Registration

If you have not registered by mail, registration take place on Thursday, September 4, from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. in the Paul Martin Centre. Or, if you have registered by mail but would like to make course changes, you can make changes at registration as well.
