



Peter Campbell - Head Coach

Peter is in his 17th year as Head Coach in the CIS including 15 years at Laurentian University. After 8 years as the Assistant Coach for the Men's and Women's National Basketball program there, Campbell moved to Head Coach for two years. He was also Head Coach for the Ontario Men's and Women's Teams for 9 years. Campbell has been named both CIS and CCAA Coach of the Year and is a 6 time OUA East Coach of the Year. Campbell has won 2 OUA Championships and 6 OUA East Championships and has had 6 trips to the CIS Finals. Peter's wife Jackie and son Jamie are glad to be at Laurier.



Jamie Lockington - Assistant Coach

Jamie is in his second year with the program at Wilfrid Laurier but completed two years as Assistant Coach with the University of Waterloo Women's Basketball Team. Lockington also assisted coaching the Lakehead Women's Basketball Team, and has completed three years as manager of Canada's Student Team. Lockington is Owner and President of Saxon Athletics and brings a competitive nature and great organizational skills to Laurier. Jamie and his wife Corey have two daughters Mackenzie and Morgan.



Paul Falco - Assistant Coach

Paul Falco is in his second year with the Laurier program. Falco played at Laurentian in the Point Guard position for Coach Campbell. Falco brings understanding of the system and knowledge of what it takes to win. Paul is a General Partner at Branttel Networks, as well as a husband to wife Sandy and a father to son Timothy.

Season Outlook 2001/2002

With a commitment to improve the basketball product on the court through changes off the court, this season will be looked upon as a turning point for Laurier Basketball. Coaches Stu Julius and Peter Campbell have now been in place for two years and one year respectively and will be looking to take their teams into uncharted waters when they take the court this season in search of success.

With this commitment to winning through new coaching personnel and renovations to the facilities, specifically the locker rooms and gymnasium, fans will be looking forward to experience some winning results.

Both teams will have a similar look when they take their show to compete for recognition with some of the best basketball programs in the OUA West Division. On the men's side, the Hawks will be in tough when competing with perennial Top Ten teams in the McMaster Marauders, Western Mustangs and the Brock Badgers. Following last season, Coach Campbell hit the recruiting trail looking to improve his roster.

With a disappointing record in 2000-2001 and missing the playoffs, Campbell has made wholesale changes to this year's lineup. Returning to the Hawks this season will be fourth year forward Adam Rogers, who will be counted on to provide them with a strong inside presence at both ends of the floor. Joining Rogers up front will be veteran Predrag Radovic who will continue his relentless hustle at both ends of the court. Joining Rogers and Radovic up front will be rookie post player, Chris Keith. If the preseason is any example of what Keith will bring to the Hawks, then the future looks bright. Keith has averaged close to a double-double and was named a tournament all-star at Concordia's pre-season tournament. Also seeing action in the post position for the Hawks this season will be Jason Popofski and Cameron Maxwell. The final forward spot will be filled by 6'7" Andrew MacKay who can grab rebounds and will also stretch defences with his ability to hit the outside shot.

Leading the backcourt will be third year point guard, Darren Viera. After being named to the OUA West Rookie Team in 1999-2000, Viera continued to lead the Hawks in the backcourt last season and will look to provide veteran leadership to the offence this year. The other veteran returning to the Hawks' backcourt will be Allen Lovett while the roster will be rounded out with rookies. At the point guard position will be Wade Currie who immediately will be counted on for his strong ball-handling skills and direction in leading the offence. Also joining the Hawks at the guard position will be rookie, Robert Green.

On the wing, strong shooting and the Hawks' outside threat will continue to be Dan Jonkers who lead the Hawks in 3pt shooting during the 2000-2001 season. Joining Jonkers will be transfer student Chris Caruso and James Hudson who both have no fear in launching the outside shot. Providing additional excitement from the wing position will be Todd Cooney who has the ability to play both inside and out and will be a leader on defence. Rounding out the wing position will be rookies Tyrone Bonas and Akanni Frederick.

After completing his first full season with the Hawks, Coach Campbell has definitely put his own signature on the lineup that includes eleven new faces. With ten of these new faces being

true freshmen, the Hawks will look to ride an energetic style in competing for a playoff position.

The mirror image of the men's program can be seen in the transition of the women's basketball team. With Coach Stu Julius entering his third season, he will be looking to get back to playoffs in the OUA West. In his first season with the Hawks, Stu lead the team back to the playoffs for the first time in four years, however was not as successful in 2000-2001. Having completed two full years at the helm of the Golden Hawks Julius will be looking to return to the playoffs this year.

Having logged a disappointing 2000-2001 season, Coach Julius worked hard in the off-season recruiting top athletes to join the Hawks this season. Rewards for his hard work have come in the forms of top recruits, Robin Roszell, Sarah Zagorski, Beth Dragon, Sarah Donkers and transfer student, Dee Channer. These five players, added to the returning veterans, will provide a strong nucleus when competing for a playoff spot this season.

Returning to the Hawks will be third year veterans Stefanie Nadalin and Christa Lodge, providing the Hawks with leadership and strong play at both ends of the floor.

Christa will now be moved to the wing spot as Sarah Zagorski will be the starting point guard. Christa will also play back-up point guard but we look to Christa to increase her scoring from this position. Also joining Christa on the wing will be second year Becky Williams who is an outstanding three point shooter. Joining Becky on the outside will be second year players Kate Richardson and Becca Frannsen. Kate has the ability to not only play outside but also inside. Becca will continue to look to be a defensive stopper, who is very athletic and can run the floor very well. Looking to control the inside will be third year Steff Nadalin who has increased her strength over the summer, and has improved in the offensive area; we have big expectations for Stef this season.

Also joining Stefanie will be first year recruit, 6'3" Robin Roszell, who has a great touch around the hoop and transfer student Dee Channer from McMaster University. Dee had an outstanding rookie season with Mac and we look to her to continue her play for the next four years. Katharine Lockey has improved her fitness level over the summer and as a result has stepped up her play as well and will continue her success from her rookie season. Katie McCool has the ability to score and run the floor. We look to Katie to step up her play this season.

With the confirmation this summer of point guard Sarah Zagorski, the Laurier Hawks will look to run and push the ball as often as possible. Sarah has the ability to control the game at any time, not only from the point guard spot but also as a scorer. With the returning vets and outstanding recruiting class, we are very excited about returning to post-season play and we truly feel that the building blocks to success are in place for now and in the future.



Stu Julius - Head Coach

The 2001 season will be Stu's third with the Golden Hawks. Julius brings 18 years of CIS coaching experience at Lakehead University where he established one of the top Interuniversity basketball programs in Canada. Julius was twice named Ontario Coach of the Year and was also named Coach of the Year for the Great Plains Athletic Conference in 1985-86. In his 18 years at Lakehead, Julius compiled a record of 311-250, and his teams only missed the post season one time. Julius has also served as an Assistant Coach for the Junior National Team, and is known throughout Canada as one of the top women's basketball coaches.




Ann Weber - Assistant Coach
