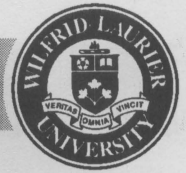
We would like to hear from you about your experiences as a participant. If you have concerns or suggestions for improvements, don't be bashful - give me a call! (884-1970 extension 2250)

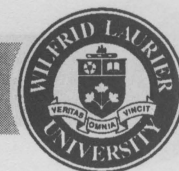

Men's Team Preview

New Faces, New Commitment... New Finish?

If you were to take time to examine the line-up from opening night one year ago for the Wilfrid Laurier Golden Hawks Men's Hockey team, and compare it to that of opening night for 1998-99, similarity is one thing that would not come into mind.

A new coach, and a line-up with as many as fifteen new faces gives this year's version of the Hawks a much different outlook from a year ago. Gone after twenty five years, and three appearances in the CIAU finals, is Head Coach Wayne Gowing, who has moved on to be Manager of Intercollegiate Athletics and Student Athlete Development for the Department of Athletics and Recreation. Gowing is replaced by long time Assistant Coach, and a member of one of Gowing's CIAU finalist clubs Tony Martindale.

"Having played here and spent eight years as an Assistant Coach to Wayne, I will be able to draw on my experience to ease the transition," noted Martindale when asked what the challenge of taking over for Gowing would be like. "It will be tough to try to fill Wayne's shoes but there are great support people in place, like Rob Hooper, which will make the transition much easier."

It is Hooper, in his second year as an Assistant Coach who Martindale credits with bringing in so many talented new faces to the program.

"Rob did a great job recruiting for us," notes Martindale who sets an achievable goal of making the playoffs in his first season as Head Coach. "We will be a young team but the players who are here all have the ability to contribute."

The coaching staff is extremely excited about the number of strong recruits who will have the ability to put the puck in the net and bolster an anaemic offense that ranked second last in the OUA last season.

A number of players with OHL experience have joined the Hawks with the hopes of turning their fortunes around quickly. Couple them with the solid nucleus of Hawks that was in place for the second half of last season and one can quickly see that this team is one that will open some eyes around the OUA in 1998-99.

Up front the Hawks will no longer have to depend on the trio of Dave Kline, Chad Brezynskie and Jeff Ambrosio as their only offensive weapons. Although the three will still contribute immensely they will have a supporting cast.

Larry Paleczny, a veteran of four OHL seasons with Belleville and Owen Sound will once again team up with Ambrosio, and centre the top line, with Brezynskie on the right side. The two were linemates when they played in Belleville in 1995-96.

Apart from Paleczny, centre Craig Jalbert from the Windsor Spitfires, and wingers Jeff Haydar (Milton Merchants), Rick

White (Kingston Voyageurs), Trevor Tokarczyk (Soo Greyhounds), Bob Whiting (Newmarket 87's) and Joe Rogers (Caledon Canadians) all have the ability to put the puck in the net and will have ample opportunity to do so.

"Guys like Paleczny, Jalbert, White, Rogers, Whiting, Haydar, and Ballantyne (defenceman, Eric) are all young guys that will be big players for this team," noted Martindale about the recruiting class. "They replaced veterans, but we felt we needed them to get better and we will get our feet wet with them."

Also expected to contribute immediately up front, is Mike Allaby who comes to Laurier after a year at Mount Allison University. The speedy centre from St. John's New Brunswick will see plenty of ice time this season. Add to the list of newcomers up front Steve French (Milton Merchants), Mark Dinely (Niagara University) and Andrew Lumb (Kingston Voyageurs) and it is easy to get excited about the potential of this team. At the same time one must remember that the OUA, and especially the OUA West Division is not the easiest place for young players to make an impact.

"We won't expect too much right off the start," noted Martindale. "We have to respect the league and focus on our number one goal of making the playoffs. If we do not do this then it will not happen."

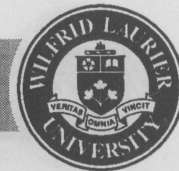
The defense which was the strong point of last years club will once again be led by Bob McQuat, who has the potential to be an All-Canadian in his fourth season at Laurier. Martin Kearns, James Hoey, Anthony Belza, and Andrew Hamilton all return from last years club and will once again be called upon. Recruits Eric Ballantyne, and Randy Austin will also see action and look for experienced veteran Mike Little to also have a big impact. The native of Calgary, Alberta is very polished and will add size and skill to the Hawks defence after honing his skills for the Portland Winter Hawks of the WHL, and Mount Allison University. Little, like Allaby, transferred to Laurier after the program closed it doors at Mount Allison.

The Hawks also seem to be in very good shape in the goaltending department where holdovers Frank Ivankovic and Trevor Francis will be joined by Darryl Whyte, who played for Martindale at Conestoga College. Ivankovic based on his performance after joining the Hawks in January of 1998 should be the number one but Whyte has been very impressive throughout camp and the exhibition schedule which makes him more than a capable back-up.

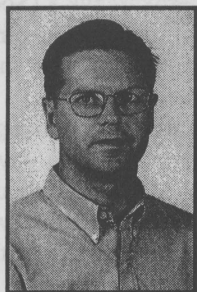
"There has been great competition from day one," notes Martindale "It has been a great thing for the hockey club."

Now that the season is rolling into full swing Martindale and his crew will face a different form of competition as they look to make the playoffs in what was the toughest division in the CIAU last season.

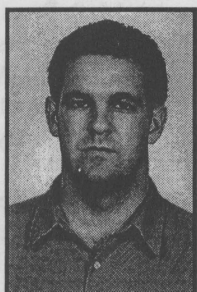
Stay tuned folks it should be a good ride.



Tony Martindale - Head Coach

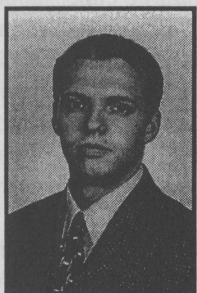

After graduating from WLU Tony took his talents south to Ohio University where he graduated with an MA in Athletic Administration. Martindale has served an Assistant to Wayne Gowing for 8 years, and most recently in 1997-98 prior to taking over the Head Coaching duties. He has previous experience as a Head Coach of Conestoga College from 1995-97, and will look to guide the Hawks to the playoffs for the first time in four seasons. Away from the Hawks Tony is very visible on the minor hockey front serving as Manager of Kitchener Minor Hockey.



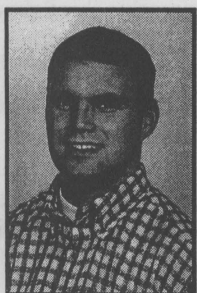
Rob Hooper - Assistant Coach

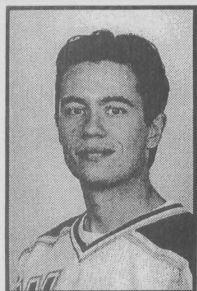
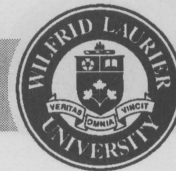
Bryce Kipfer - Assistant Coach

Mark Pedersen - Assistant Coach

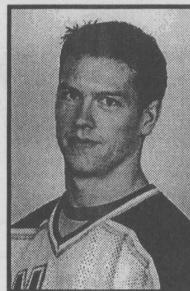

Women's Team Preview

Hawks look to fly to new heights

One year removed from a disappointing finish to the 1997-98 season this year's version of the Golden Hawks women's hockey team will be out to show the OUA that they are a team on a mission. Their mission seems clear, a place in the CIAU championships.

"This year will be a good one," notes Head Coach Josh Batley "We have all the components for a championship team."

Batley has good reason to be excited since the entire line-up from last season, with the exception of two players, returns from last year's team that finished third in the OUA, after losing a disappointing semi-final to Guelph.

"With the number of returnees and the addition of five new recruits who have the ability to make an impact on the team, this team has the potential to do very well." added the second year Head Coach, "We also have the best goaltending in the league and all of our players have gained a year of experience."

Once again Batley will look to OUA All-Star Cheryl Pounder to lead the offensive charge. Pounder who may see only limited action this season with the Hawks, because of other commitments, is a three time OUA All-Star. She was tied for the league lead in goals last season, and was an Honourable Mention All-Canadian. Her ability in both ends of the rink allows her to be considered one of if not the premier player in the OUA.

Aside from Pounder, big things are expected from third year forward Caroline Hall who Batley believes has a legitimate shot at the OUA scoring title. The native of Victoria B.C. worked extremely hard in the off-season to improve her ability and looks like she will put up big numbers for the Hawks in 1998-99.

Fourth year veteran Jen Krog, this year's captain, will once again be called upon to lead the Hawks in key situations. Her ability to perform under pressure allows the coaching staff to depend on her at all times. She will also look to improve on her offensive statistics from a year ago. Co-Rookie of the Year Lisa Backman will once again be looked upon to put the puck in the net, as will first year Hawks, Heather Allan and Donna Forbes.

Collectively this group of Hawk forwards gives the coaching staff two lines that will be looked upon to produce offensively. Should they falter the Hawks are in good hands with two of the best goalies in the entire league and possibly the CIAU.

"All three of our goaltenders have the ability to star in this league," adds Batley, whose team led the league in goals against average in 1997-98. "Their play will be the key to our success."

Joyce Torrington, last year's Co-Rookie of the Year and Charmaine Boteju a former team MVP, will split the duties between the pipes. As for just how, Batley notes "Whoever is hot." Not a bad position for the coach to be in as the season is set to begin.

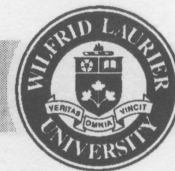
On defense the loss of two members of last year's line-up will be felt but Batley is confident that third year Hawk Marie Hahn, who will move to defense from forward will be able to help fill the holes. The return of fifth year Hawk Heather Warren is also a bonus for the coaching staff, who if they need to be concerned about a certain area of the team it is on the blue line.

"The extra games will be such an advantage" notes Batley, whose team for the first time will be involved in games outside their OUA regular season and playoff competition "It will allow us to be better come playoff time."

Come playoff time the Hawks will have to be ready to go since a win in their first game will give them a trip to the National Championships, and a loss will allow them to finish no better than they did last season. With heavy competition coming as usual from Guelph and Toronto, Batley and the Hawks will have to work hard day in and day out if they hope to make their first ever appearance at the CIAU finals.



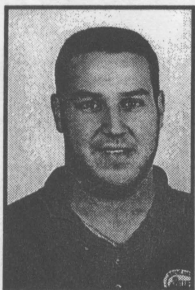
Women's Hockey Coaches
