Waterloo Lutheran Athletic Tradition

Post war highlites . . .

In 1945, W.U.C. basketball team won the Industrial YMCA League Championship . . . In 1946, the rugby team posted an undefeated record . . . In 1947, the rugby team defeated University of Western Ontario, 13-5, and the hockey team repeated this feat with a 5-3 victory.

These victories were the first to serve notice that the small one-building college (Willison Hall) could generate the desire to defeat opponents from much larger universities.

In 1950, the basketball team repeated as the Industrial YMCA League Champ . . . 1952 was the first year of football for W.U.C. Under the guidance of Carl Totzke, they posted an undefeated 2-0 record over Huron College . . . In 1953, the football team defeated Guelph Agricultural College to begin Lutheran's longest inter-collegiate athletic rivalry, of 18 years. This year's Guelph game marks the end of this series as Guelph moves to the OQAA. The hockey series with Ryerson will become the longest rivalry . . . In 1954, the basketball team lost the OBA Intermediate Championship to Guelph in the finals of the play-off. In 1958, the basketball team was proclaimed the college co-champions with Osgoode Hall . . . In 1961, the name of the athletic teams was changed from the "Mules" to the "Hawks" . . . In 1962, the football team posted a 5-0-1 undefeated championship, and the basketball team was proclaimed Junior College Champions . . . In 1963, the football squad recorded another undefeated championship. The basketball team posted a 17-7 record and lost the OBA championship to Laurentian in a play-off.

In 1964, the basketball team posted an undefeated OBA League Championship . . . In 1965, the basketball team recorded their second undefeated championship . . . In 1966, the basketball team gained their third consecutive undefeated championship . . . In 1967, the football team had an undefeated 8-0 league record but lost the National Championship to St. Xavier in the first College Bowl Game. The basketball team won the league championship with a 12-1 record, but lost in the semi-finals of the first National Championship . . . In 1968, the basketball team posted an undefeated league championship and won the Canadian Inter-Collegiate Athletic Union National Championship . . . In 1969, the football team won the league championship with a 7-1 record and defeated St. Mary's in the Atlantic Bowl, but were defeated in the College Bowl by Queen's University. The basketball team won their sixth consecutive OIAA Championship but lost to Windsor in the finals of the National Championship.

Note worthy alumni of the athletic community, who have persued their academic careers are: Glenn Carroll, former director of the school of Business and Economics, who starred on the 1953 football "Mules"; Dr. Welf Heick, chairman of the History Department, co-captain of the 1953 basketball squad; John Lewis, Geography Department lecturer, played on the 1962 and 1963 basketball squads; and Carl Totzke, Director of Athletics, University of Waterloo, starred on the 1945 and 1946 rugby and basketball teams.

Athletic alumnus who have excelled in professional sports are: Ed Turek of the Hamilton Tiger Cats, Paul Markle and Dave Knechtel of the Toronto Argonauts, Doug Strong of the Winnipeg Blue Bombers and John Kruspe of the Ottawa Roughriders.

The athletic community is anxiously awaiting the construction of the proposed athletic complex that will benefit the entire student body by offering facilities to insure their physical fitness and health. It should serve to make the athletic teams more competetive in the future.

The present athletic contingent, after the dismal team records of the 1970 season, vows to return to the championship form of past tradition. The composite record of the football teams since the 1962 season reveal a highly successful 48 wins, 14 defeats and 2 ties. The basketball team's composite record of league play since 1963 shows a fantastic 85 wins and 9 losses. The hockey team, before the 1970 season, had finished second in the league four consecutive times. These tremendous records are an extension of the pride and determination of these teams and the loyalty and enthusiasm of their fans.

The Hawks have just completed a five game series on the road. Having won their first three league games at Rverson, Trent and Brock they travelled to Thunder Bay to play Howard Lockhart's Nor'westers of Lakehead University.

In what appeared to be the hottest half of the season for the Nor'westers, the Hawks found themselves down 62-33 at the half. Shooting poorly the Hawks couldn't contend with the four Americans in the Lakehead starting five. A much improved second half held the Nor'westers to 1 point net gain, the final being 102-72.

Keyed up and looking for a victory against their old coach, the Hawks played an excellent first half on Saturday night, holding Lakehead to 41 points. Their 25 point half, however, was the result of their poorest half of the season. Only 10 for 41 shots, 24%, found the marks as the Hawks couldn't buy a basket. Nearly 7 minutes of the game had passed before Chris Coulthard dropped one through, and that was by no means a clean basket.

Determined to put up a good showing against Lockhart, the Hawks came out looking their best in the second half. Again they had their problems scoring and fell 23 points behind in the first three minutes of the second half.

Finally the tempo changed. Putting it all together the Hawks finally got hot and chopped the Lakehead lead to 5 points by the nine minute mark. The seniors of Lakehead were playing their last of their college career on home court and were not to be denied. Holding an 80-74 edge at the buzzer, they ran their undefeated record on home court to 35 games over the past three years. Impressive to say the least.

The weekend on the whole, had a variety of nostalgic overtones, and Lockhart was impressed with both the Hawks and their new coach, Don Smith.

Tonight's game is crucial in the true sense of the word. A win could clinch the Hawks first place position and ensure the championship game being held on home court. With York a short step behind, a loss of more than 5 points would give York a definite in for first place if they won the remainder of their schedule.

Since the Hawks play best here at home, tonight's game could be their biggest of the season.
