


Our Progress

1834	St. Peter's Congregation was organized under the guidance of Almighty God.
1842	Title was received to our property for the first church building on our present site. The build- ing known as "The Old Frame Church."
1854	The Congregation was able to purchase the deed to our property from four laymen who purchased the deed when it was sold by the sheriff.
1856	The plans for the building of a stone church were approved. The old church was rolled away and construction on our present church building began.
1913	The present parsonage was built on the former burial grounds at the rear of the church.
1928	The interior of the church was redecorated and the pipe organ installed.
1934	The Centennial, one hundred years of preaching the Gospel and administering the Sacraments, was fittingly celebrated.
1954	Plans for an Educational Building, the addition of a chancel and the renovation of the nave of the church were made.
1958	The Church was rededicated and the Educational Building dedicated.
1959	Under God's Guidance we are able to gratefully remember His continuing Grace and Favor through the services of praise on this the One Hundred and Twenty-fifth Anniversary.
