


Our Past . . .

1834 St. Peter's congregation was organized under the guidance of Almighty God. 1842 Title was received to our property for the first church building on our present site. The building known as "The Old Frame Church". 1854 The congregation was able to purchase the deed to our property from four laymen who purchased the deed when it was sold by the sheriff. 1856 The plans for the building of a stone church were approved. The old church was rolled away and construction on our present church building started. 1913 Present parsonage was built on the former burial grounds at the rear of the church. 1928 The interior of the church was redecorated and the pipe organ installed. 1954 Plans for an Educational Building, and the addition of a chancel and renovation of the nave of the church.


The church was re-dedicated and the

The modern Kitchen and Kitchenette equipment provides easier and more pleasant surroundings in which to work.




A self-contained Boiler Room, with Firedoor, eliminates the many hazards which existed and provides a more controlled and satisfactory heating system.

The Church Office containing the vault and office equipment permits the administrative work of the church to be conducted in a more satisfactory way. The control panel for the sound system is also located in this room.




The Church Parlour with its furnishings provides a comfortable and relaxing atmosphere for our members and may be used for smaller group meetings.

The chapel located beneath the chancel of the church may be used by groups within the church for private devotions, meditation, and small weddings.







With such spacious and practical facilities our Sunday School, Luther League, United Lutheran Church Women, Choir and other groups within the church will have more opportunities of expressing in a Christian way the faith we confess.
