Morrisburg, Ont. March 14, 1917

Dear Mother:-

We had our Luther League last night and as it was nearly eleven o'clock when we got home, I found it too late to write you then. As I have Lenten Service to-night I will try to get in my letters before hand. We have been having some very fine weather lately, sunshiny and bright, but still too cold for the snow to melt much. Today we are having it somewhat cloudy and colder and it looks as though it might snow by night. We had a heavy snow storm all day Sunday again. It was like the storm of Monday a week ago and piled the snow up in great drifts. It was all I could do to get through to the lower Church Sunday afternoon but I made it, though not many others did. I had 13 out including my two boys. In the morning I had 24 out here. In the evening after the storm had somewhat abated and the side walks were ploughed out, I had a congregation of 45 or 50 out. Yesterday the ice began breaking out of the river. I saw one cake go down that must have occupied an acre in area. The snow is beaten down somewhat in the roads, but is still very deep elsewhere.
