

Waterloo, Ont, June 20, 1956.

The treasurer's report was given and showed a bank balance of \$3594.06. It was moved by Mrs. Schatz and seconded by Mrs. Ireland that the report be approved as read.

A letter of thanks was read by the secretary from Miss Lois Bimm, the recipient of the scholarship for this year.

Mrs. W. Gillespie presented the Promotional Committee's report. The Promotional program has been in operation for about one year. To promote means to move forward or advance, stated Mrs. Gillespie and this, she said is our aim in the Auxiliary. Key women have been busy in the conferences.
