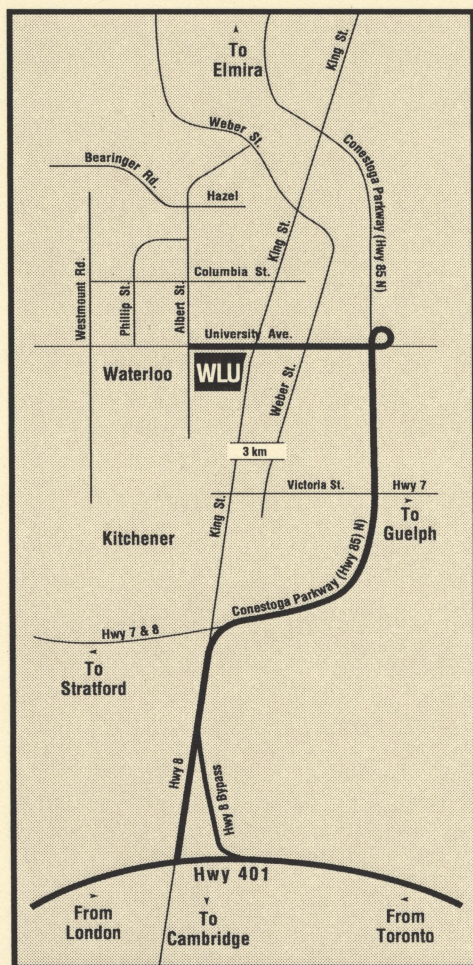

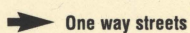
AREA MAP:

Parking

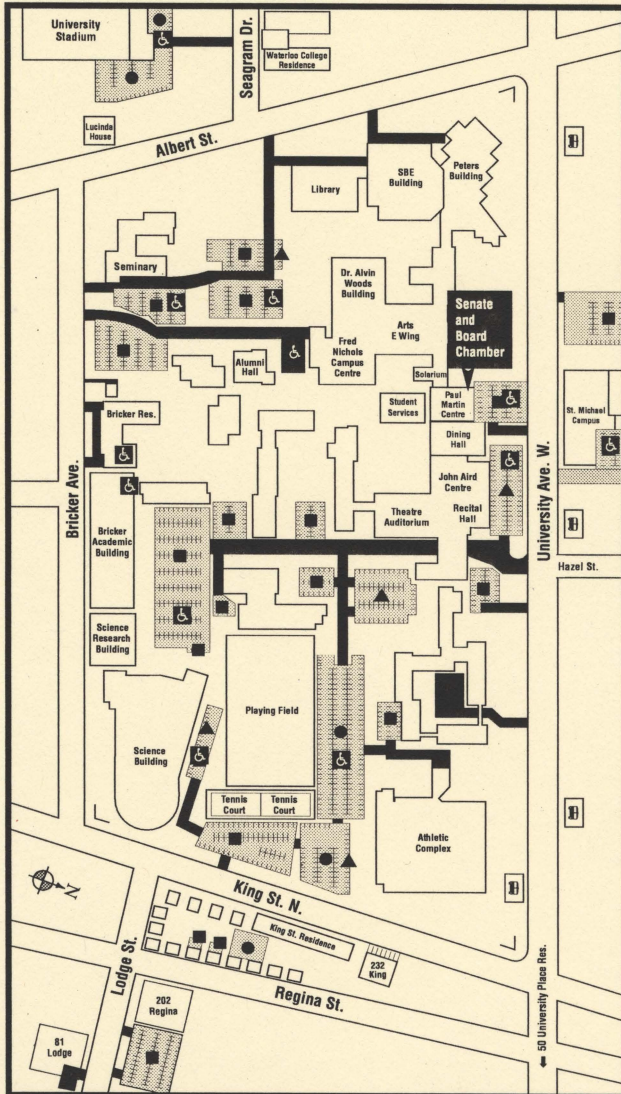
