Dear Mother:-

As I only got home to-day at noon I had no opportunity to write to you until to-night. I left home Saturday directly after dinner for Hamilton going all the way by trally, about 65 or 70 miles. I had a very pleasant trip but also a very busy day yesterday. I preached Sunday morning and last night, delivered an address before the Sunday School in the afternoon and another address on the Seminary before the Luther League after the service last night. In spite of the fact that I had practically no time for preparation I am happy to say that I made a very favorable impression upon the Hamilton people. The collection at the two services for the day amounted to over \$75<sup>00</sup>. They also paid me \$10 and my traveling expenses which amounted to \$2<sup>50</sup> more. I expect to get down there again in the summer in the interest of the Seminary and College in my campaign for students. The Seminary Board met last week and as was expected made some considerable
