Our History

In 1910, the Lutheran Church entered into an agreement to establish a Lutheran Seminary. The majority of Lutherans in Ontario lived in the vicinity of Waterloo and Berlin (Kitchener), and Waterloo was selected when its citizens offered a tract of land on the boundary of the town. In 1911 the Evangelical Lutheran Seminary of Canada opened its doors. Facilities for pre-theological education were established in 1914 with courses leading to senior matriculation given in Waterloo College School.

In 1924 the Waterloo College of Arts, providing courses in postsecondary education in a four-year program, was established. In 1925 the Faculty of Arts, under the name of Waterloo College, affiliated with the University of Western Ontario. Waterloo College soon began to offer honours degree programs in the arts.

The affiliation with the University of Western Ontario ended in 1960 when the Seminary obtained a revised charter changing the name of the institution to Waterloo Lutheran University.

On November 1, 1973, Bill 178 was given Royal Assent by the Lieutenant Governor, William Ross Macdonald (former chancellor), and Waterloo Lutheran University became Wilfrid Laurier University, one of Ontario's provincially funded universities.

The Convocation Ceremony

Convocation is the most solemn ceremony within the university community. Since their beginnings in the Middle Ages, universities have performed this ceremony in order to grant degrees to their students and also to welcome those students into the community of scholars which has trained them.

The conferring of the degree is symbolized either by an acknowledgement or handshake from the Chancellor or the President or other conferring officers of the university.

As an outward sign of his or her new state, the student wears a hood. Each degree within a university has a hood of unique colours and trim in order that the student's status may be recognized—indeed every university guards its own set of hoods from use by any other university.

In order to recognize the nature of this event for the students involved, the university asks that parents and friends of the students participating in this ceremony withhold their applause until all members being admitted to each degree have left the dais. Students are asked to remain in their seats while other graduates receive their degrees.

The Academic Degrees

The academic degree is a title conferred on an individual by a university as recognition of the completion of a course of study or for a certain attainment. In Canada, the three stages in higher education are represented by the degrees of bachelor, master and doctor. Wilfrid Laurier University is given the authority to grant degrees by the Wilfrid Laurier University Act.

Historically, the master's degree was the original degree offered. In the Middle Ages it was awarded to those scholars who, after a series of examinations, were found intellectually and morally fit to teach. Although we are accustomed to thinking of the bachelor's degree as the original degree, it was initially used to designate master's students progressing toward their final degree. They were thus novices or 'bachelors,' who were given permission to teach beginning students. The bachelor's degree was subsequently established as a first degree, a position it had when Oxford University in England was founded in the 12th century. The degree of doctor, which comes from the Latin word for 'teacher,' was first awarded by the University of Bologna and the University of Paris in the 12th century.

The bachelor's degree is awarded at the honours and general level. An honours degree program emphasizes the acquisition of a broad and deep knowledge of the student's chosen honours subject, including both skill at applying the subject and appreciation of its relation to general knowledge and society. A general degree program emphasizes a balance between an in-depth understanding of the student's major subject and a knowledge and appreciation of other fields. Completion of an honours degree normally takes four years and a general degree, three years.

The master's degree is the second degree in higher education. Students complete concentrated and specialized work at a more advanced level in an academic discipline or professional area. Most course work is within the field of specialization and a research project or thesis is normally required. Some master's degrees provide professional qualifications. The master's degree usually requires one or two years of study after a bachelor's degree.

The doctoral degree is the highest academic degree granted by a university. Candidates for the degree spend several years in the advanced study of a specialized field of knowledge. The capstone of the degree is the doctoral dissertation, an extended work based upon independent research. The dissertation demonstrates the candidate's command of both the subject matter and the exacting methods of scholarship, and makes an original contribution to knowledge.



THE CEREMONY

Honorary Degrees

Honorary degrees are conferred by Wilfrid Laurier University in recognition of outstanding scholarly, creative, or professional achievement or distinguished public and community service. The university may grant the following honorary degrees: Doctor of Laws (LLD), Doctor of Letters (DLitt), Doctor of Science (DSc) and Doctor of Divinity (DDiv).

Wilfrid Laurier University Mace

The mace of Wilfrid Laurier University was officially presented by the Euler family at the 1963 fall convocation in memory of The Honourable W.D. Euler, former senator of Canada and the first chancellor of the university. It weighs 16 pounds and was manufactured by the firm of Henry Birks Limited, Montreal.

The ferrule near the base of the shaft contains ivory from a walrus tusk obtained from Coral Harbour, Northwest Territories. The ten-sided shaft, representing the ten provinces, merges into the head of the mace which bears the ten provincial crests. The wood used at the point where the shaft meets the head of the mace is elm taken from the bannister post of Conrad Hall, the original seminary building. Above this are four crests relating to the history of the institution: a crest of Waterloo County, the Luther Coat of Arms, the crest of the Waterloo Lutheran Seminary and the coat of arms of the University of Western Ontario.

The head of the mace is made of maple and bears the Federal Coat of Arms, above which is the monogram of Queen Elizabeth II, during whose reign the university's charter was granted. On the reverse side is the crest of Wilfrid Laurier University and the monogram of King George V, during whose reign the original charter was granted. The top of the mace is a crown, mounted with jewels, symbolizing the authority of the State.

Faculty of Arts

The processional banner of the Faculty of Arts contains a representation of the world as studied by the social sciences and humanities disciplines from individuals to societies, across cultures, and over time. The interrelatedness of the disciplines within the Faculty of Arts is emphasized by the fact that many of these images can represent more than one discipline. Laurier's colours are woven across the top and down the left-hand side of the banner. The bottom left-hand corner contains the flame of truth, representing the unend-ing quest for truth and knowledge encouraged within the Faculty of Arts. The banner for the Faculty of Arts was designed and executed by Sally Gray.

Faculty of Science

The processional banner of the Faculty of Science represents the tree of knowledge, bearing many leaves to suggest the gathering together of many scholars. The blossoms borne by this tree signify the *Seven Liberal Arts* of the medieval curriculum, from which the contemporary arts and sciences have sprung. The purple and gold of the design are traditional symbols of excellence, accompanied by black and white, the twin constituents of light, symbolic of wisdom, and green, the colour that in our culture most potently symbolizes life. The banner was designed by Nancy-Lou Patterson and made by Isobel R. King. The banner was first designed for the former Faculty of Arts and Science. With the creation of two new faculties, the Faculty of Science adopted the banner as its own.

School of Business & Economics

The processional banner for the School of Business & Economics (SBE) is visually abstract in style, relying on simple geometric shapes, in solid colours, to convey its meaning. The symbolic dualisms of the banner's colour and design are a reflection of the pairings of aims and attributes describing the school: business-economics, research-teaching, community-society, students-staff-faculty, old values-new perspectives, think internationally-act locally. The geometric shapes of the design and the layered construction of the banner pay homage to the quilting culture in the local community.

The bold, blue/green letters, SBE, contrast in colour and value with the background and are easily read, even in low light. The background is evenly divided between Laurier's official colours, purple and gold, and the two colour areas are blended from one to the other in a scattering of small squares over the surface. The superimposed squares shift in colour from purple to blue, and from gold to white, representing the colours associated with business and economics. This method of blending two contrasting colours together is drawn directly from computer technology using a graphics software program that assigns one of two colours to each pixel according to an appropriate algorithm. This results in a smooth blend overall, while retaining interesting unevenness in detail. Variations in surface texture and lustre in the fabrics cause light to reflect from the surface of the banner in different ways, further adding to the overall effect. The banner was designed and made by Ellen Adams.

Faculty of Music

The banner for the Faculty of Music was designed and executed by Ralph Beney, who taught Design for Textile at Laurier. The pinks and reds in the banner reflect the academic colour of music, which was originally scarlet but changed to pink several centuries ago. The bells are universal musical instruments. As rhythm is an essential characteristic of music, the design is rhythmic, lively.

Just as most music is basically abstract, in the sense that it does not represent other objects, the design of the banner is basically abstract. Still, just as we can hear references to birds and storms and other things in music, we can imagine that the panels of the banner represent the keys found on French horns and keyboard instruments, and that the circles represent cymbals or drums, and possibly references to musical notational symbols. The important representation, however, is of the rhythmic vitality of music.

Faculty of Social Work

Designed by Ralph Beney in 1994 for the Faculty of Social Work, whose academic colour is yellow, the representational banner conveys an interconnecting relationship between individuals and their communities, constituting our dynamic and complex society.

The Faculty of Social Work's caring and warm environment is conveyed by means of an ongoing, forward-moving open system, centred on people and their needs.

Faculty of Graduate Studies

The Faculty of Graduate Studies encourages interactive and collegial learning by fostering independent thinking and self-creation in a mentoring environment. The banner, designed and created by Ralph Beney, includes the colours in the hoods and gowns worn by graduate students at convocation. Arranged in an upwardly, forward-looking and dynamic "pyramid of learning," the interaction of the colours represents the potential for interdisciplinary study at the graduate level. The pyramid symbolizes graduate studies as the capstone of the formal learning process.

PROCESSIONAL BANNERS

Waterloo Lutheran Seminary

The Waterloo Lutheran Seminary processional banner presents a "cosmic christology" in visual form. By Word and Wisdom, God creates the cosmos, makes a covenant with humankind as conscious members of that cosmos, and redeems creation in fulfilment of that covenant. The theme of the banner is the biblical affirmation "The just shall live by faith," which parallels the Seminary motto, "By faith we walk." The banner was designed by Nancy-Lou Patterson and quilted by Helen Weber.

The border consists of alternating blocks signifying Justification and Faith. Using the Seminary's school colours, the blocks signifying Justification combine a gold cross and a maroon ground. Faith is signified by blocks in rainbow colours, recalling the promise of God in Genesis 9:17: "This is the sign of the covenant that I have established between me and all flesh that is on earth." The interlocking relationship between creator and creation is symbolized by the cross which links the earth to the cosmos. God makes contact with humankind through the Word, Christ, and through the sacraments which are signified by the stream of blue water flowing from the cross (baptism), and by the stream of red blood also flowing from the cross (holy communion). This is placed on a field of 12 stars symbolizing holy Wisdom.

The Marshal's Baton

Dr. Fred Binding, a faculty member in the Department of Psychology for 32 years retired in July 2003. He had served as the university marshal for ten years. Sadly, Dr. Binding died in August 2003. In memory of his contribution to convocation ceremonies, artist Rex Lingwood was commissioned to create a marshal's baton.

In the baton, the artist incorporates a range of visual references that relate to the graduation ceremony, both directly and symbolically. In keeping with the nature of the ceremony, some of the forms are traditionally associated with ceremonial staffs, and the baton's design echoes the elaborate theatricality of the event and the flair brought to the occasion by Dr. Fred Binding. The ends may be read as abstracted figure forms wrapped in the academic gown and hood, with details in the university colours: purple and gold. These forms also read as plant buds, symbolizing the life stage of the graduates. The Greek alphabet is inset into an internal side surface in the shaft of the baton. This is a reference to the interests of Dr. Fred Binding. It also acknowledges that language is at the core of university education and that the Greek language has particular importance in western culture.

The commission of the baton was made possible with the generous support of the Department of Psychology and Wilfrid Laurier University Retirees' Association.

The Laurier Society

The Laurier Society is an umbrella organization that recognizes all individual donors to Wilfrid Laurier University. The WLUAA, a volunteer driven, non-profit organization, is the official body representing Laurier alumni. The elected Board of Directors is representative of all academic faculties and many different decades.

The WLUAA supports Wilfrid Laurier University with revenue from alumni services, such as group home, auto and life insurance, an affinity credit card and financial services. WLUAA revenues help to fund alumni programs, university projects, student groups, scholarships, homecoming and *Laurier Campus*, the alumni magazine.

The mission of the WLUAA is:

To foster alumni interaction with the students, the university, and the community; to promote active alumni participation in the affairs of the university; to assist in securing the university as an independent institution; and to enhance the university's profile as a small institution committed to academic excellence.



doday Wilfrid Laurier University bestows the honour of a Doctor of Laws degree upon this man, the Honourable James Karl Bartleman. A Canadian man. An Indigenous man. A citizen of the world.

For five years, he has served as the Lieutenant Governor of Ontario, the Queen's representative in this province. In this role, he has honoured his Indigenous roots while carrying out his duties to the Crown and to the people of Ontario. He has brought these worlds together. In championing challenging causes – anti-racism, the stigma of mental illness, and the welfare of young Native people – he has been a true leader and a true mentor to Indigenous people and to all people.

In launching five literacy initiatives, he has opened up a new world of reading and discovery to young Native people in Ontario and beyond. His two book drives have established libraries in virtually all First Nations communities in Ontario; his school twinning program is building bridges between Native and non-Native students in Ontario and Nunavut; his 36 summer literacy camps as well as Club Amick, his reading club for children, are bringing new skills and new hope to the rising generation of young Native people in Ontario's North. These initiatives are transforming many young lives. We owe a great debt of gratitude to this man, for his vision, his determination, and his ability to inspire others.

The personal story of his rise from humble beginnings, from a childhood of poverty and discrimination, has touched many hearts. In the past four years, he has published four volumes of memoirs, which detail his childhood and his distinguished 35-year career in Canada's foreign service, during which he served as ambassador to Cuba, Israel, NATO and the European Union; as High Commissioner to Cyprus, South Africa and Australia; and as Foreign Policy Advisor to the Prime Minister. The royalties from these memoirs are donated to the causes which he champions as Lieutenant Governor.

He is a civil man who has brought the civility of Canada to many parts of the globe. He honours the teachings of the Elders who would lovingly refer to him as having the unique gift of "walking between the two worlds", the mainstream world and the Indigenous world, without losing himself. In 1999 he was honoured by his Indigenous community with the National Aboriginal Achievement Award.

Now we honour the Honourable James K. Bartleman in the traditional Indigenous way with a prayer and an honour song. The Eagle Honour song will be performed by the Good Hearted Women Singers, many of whom are from Wilfrid Laurier, where more than 25 Aboriginal people work, a very rare occurrence to have so many Aboriginal people working and contributing to the life of the University.

The prayer for the Leader

Great Creator you have given me my walk, my journey on this earth. I do not know what comes next, and what I have just passed now makes sense to me. You have given me instinct and insight, which helped me on this journey of service to the people, to the family, to the nation, to the earth our Mother, and the Universe to which we are constantly connected. You have protected me when I have been hurt and given me the medicines to get through the physical hurt, the mental hurt, the emotional hurt, and the spiritual hurt. And still the vision of my journey was clear and yet unknown.

I knew my service to creation was not for me, even though people give me recognition. I knew I had a family to teach me purpose for love and for life. My larger family of Man also taught me that "all my relations" included all living things. Man is set in a relationship with all Creation and dependant on all things for our life. The Seven Sacred Teachings of the Anishnabe people, Love, Respect, Courage, Honesty, Humility, Wisdom and Truth, guide me as I walk through this life I have been given.

doday, we honour Fred Kuntz for his longstanding contributions to the Canadian newspaper industry. Most recently, after serving as publisher of *The Record* in Kitchener for five years, Fred was appointed in October 2006 to the position of editor-in-chief at the *Toronto Star*, Canada's largest daily newspaper. Clearly, this position is one of the most prestigious and important editorial roles in the industry in Canada. Upon his appointment, *the Star's* publisher was quoted as follows:

"I have worked directly with Fred for the past five years and know well his passion for great journalism and excellent newspapers... Fred has strengthened every aspect of The Record and leaves a legacy of excellence."

Fred was born in Hamilton to Dutch immigrant parents and grew up in Etobicoke. He graduated with a BA from Ryerson University's School of Journalism. While studying at Ryerson, Fred worked part-time at *The Toronto Sun* and the *Toronto Star*. Fred later became an honours graduate of the Canadian Securities course.

Following his formal education at Ryerson, Fred began a distinguished career in the newspaper industry in various organizations, with his longest single tenure of 19 years at the *Toronto Star*. During this period, from 1981 to 2000, Fred held a variety of positions including senior editor, business editor, city editor, deputy managing editor and Saturday editor. He was lead editor for many award-winning projects, including the 1998 Michener Award co-winning series on mental illness among Toronto's homeless, and the first two National Newspaper Awards for business reporting won by *Toronto Star* reporters.

In 2000, Fred was appointed associate editor at the *Globe and Mail*, where he oversaw news editing, photography and design, and helped implement a redesign of the newspaper.

In 2001, Fred was appointed group publisher of Grand River Valley Newspapers, which included two daily newspapers: *The Record* in Waterloo Region, and the *Guelph Mercury*. Under Fred's leadership, both papers experienced growth in both earnings and readership. In addition, *The Record* was awarded the 2002 Michener Award for Meritorious Public Service Journalism, one of the highest distinctions in Canadian journalism; the 2003 Canadian Journalism Foundation Award for Excellence in Editorial; and numerous Ontario Newspaper Awards. During his tenure, Fred also oversaw a number of significant corporate projects, including the launch of two high-quality magazines dealing with lifestyles and business, *The Record*'s conversion to morning delivery in 2002, and the newspaper's move to a design-award winning office in downtown Kitchener in 2005.

In addition to his editorial and publishing roles in the newspaper industry, Fred has been extensively involved in his local community by serving on the boards of the Kitchener-Waterloo Art Gallery, the Rotary Club of Kitchener, and the Salvation Army Community Advisory Board of Waterloo Region. As a "highly respected individual who is fondly remembered for... his dedication as an outstanding volunteer, mentor and passionate community leader," Fred received the Michael R. Follett Community Leader Award in 2007 from the Greater Kitchener Waterloo Chamber of Commerce. The criteria for this Community Leader Award are also very much relevant today as we honour Fred Kuntz for this Honorary Degree from Wilfrid Laurier University.



Gordon K. Greene

G ordon Greene's academic training is that of a medieval music historian - particularly of the 14th and 15th centuries. His birth on a farm in southwest Alberta, however, might well have inducted him into career paths quite different from the one that he eventually chose. He received his PhD in musicology in 1971 from Indiana University, by which time he was already an experienced pedagogue. He taught for several years at the University of Alberta before joining the Faculty of Music at the University of Western Ontario in 1966. He was chair of the music history department there until 1975, moving to Laurier's Faculty of Music in 1978 and serving as dean of that faculty from 1979 to 1989. Over his career, he has been the recipient of seven SSHRC grants to study the manuscripts of late-medieval French secular polyphonic music. This research resulted in his editing of five volumes of that musical repertory in a monumental anthology published by L'Oiseau-Lyre that remains the scholarly benchmark for this music to this day.

Dr. Greene's research has resulted in lectures at the Schola Cantorum in Basel, Switzerland, and in visiting professorships in Australia. He is a past-president of the Canadian University Music Society, and a contributor to the *New Grove Dictionary of Music*, the *Dictionary of the Middle Ages*, and the *Encyclopedia of Music in Canada*. But Dr. Greene not only studies and writes about music - he makes it. He has directed choirs at all the universities where he has taught, possesses a fine bass-baritone voice, and has always been a strong supporter of musical performance of all ages and cultures.

His engagement with the medieval world also extends far beyond musicological pursuits. In keeping with the oral tradition that defined medieval European life, Dr. Greene possesses that rare gift of storytelling. And if you are lucky, he might include a recitation from *The Canterbury Tales*, complete with the best Middle English pronunciation. Or sing you a Ukrainian Christmas carol - in Ukrainian. His expert knowledge of medieval cooking puts a fascinating spin on social events he has hosted.

As dean of the Faculty of Music at Laurier for 11 years, he saw that institution through an intense period of positive growth. Continuing to teach courses as he did during that time, Dr. Greene never lost direct connection with the students, nor the warm synergy he enjoyed with his faculty. He made us feel that he was our colleague, not our boss. He has never lost the sense that students, faculty members, staff members and dean form a unit, striving for the same ends, each having an indispensable and crucial role to play in that process. His extraordinary ability to reconcile his own personal views with the collective wishes of a group has made him the quintessential leader. As a manager, he respects rules without being ruled by them. He is a humanist and a people person. Predisposed as he is to the individual, he has always understood that special circumstances demand ad hoc flexibility, not a Procrustean adherence to an arbitrary standard. His understanding of the academic life of a university is subtle and profound, and informed by his commitment to the liberal arts. His administrative style has never been opaque or exclusive, and he will as readily volunteer to assist at a community fund-raising bingo for a local charity as he will chair a Senate committee meeting or an academic conference session.

His commitment to both academic life generally and to Laurier specifically has been total and life-encompassing. No less than 16 years after retirement, Dr. Greene was prepared, and even eager, to return to his post as interim dean of the faculty for the 2005-06 academic year. He brought not only an extraordinary energy and commitment to that task, but also a lifetime of wisdom and a great humanity.

doday, at Wilfrid Laurier University, we honour Susan Burke, a woman whose commitment to conserving and re-engaging with our material past represents values that we at the university also pursue.

Susan Burke earned an Honours BA degree in French and German from McMaster University in 1963, and taught school for five years in Toronto. However, interested in material culture and built heritage, she entered museum work, serving as chief curator at Kings Landing Historical Settlement in New Brunswick before returning to Ontario.

She has served as consultant on costume and other aspects of material culture to CBC Television, the National Film Board of Canada, and the National Museums of Canada. Closer to home, she has served on the Local Architectural Conservancy Advisory Committee in Kitchener, has contributed professionally to the Kitchener Industrial Artifacts Committee, and has helped to found both the Waterloo County and Area Quilt Festival, and the Grand River Hospital's Archives Project. Among her publications is her co-edited book, *From Pennsylvania to Waterloo: Pennsylvania-German Folk Culture in Transition*, published by Wilfrid Laurier University Press. In 2000, she graduated with distinction with the M.Phil degree in Decorative Arts from the University of Glasgow.

Most important of all is Susan Burke's work with the historic Joseph Schneider Haus Musuem and Gallery in the heart of Kitchener. Hired as restoration curator to restore the site in 1979, Susan Burke was appointed manager/curator in 1981, and has developed it not only as a community museum but also as what is now an official National Historic Site. Today, the Joseph Schneider Haus Museum and Gallery boasts the definitive collection of German-Canadian folk art.

Education programs are integral to her vision for the Joseph Schneider Haus, and so far more than 200,000 school children have experienced its sixteen different hands-on programs.

In 2002, Susan Burke doubled the focus of her department's mandate. Having concentrated for so long on the Pennsylvania-Dutch heritage of north Waterloo County, she made the decision to concentrate, also, on the Scottish-Canadian traditions of south Waterloo County. Thus she added a historically significant Scottish labourer's cottage in Cambridge, the McDougall Cottage, to her portfolio.

Her honours and awards are many, and include the Heritage Canada Regional Award of Honour in 1982 for her restoration work on the Joseph Schneider Haus, the Ontario Museum Association Award for Outstanding Achievement in 1989, and the Sally Thorsen Award of Excellence from the Waterloo Regional Heritage Foundation in 1999.

For professional colleagues and for the innumerable guests to the Joseph Schneider Haus, Susan Burke's generous hospitality in her office, her boundless enthusiasm in her public tasks, her energetic spirit in behind-the-scenes projects have had an ever-expanding effect on our understanding of who and what we are in this part of Canada. She is a brilliant and gracious visionary who has seen possibilities in what our culture had left unattended, and has breathed life into what we had too long ignored. We are delighted to honour her today.

oday's honouree is Geoffrey Stevens, who has made a unique and outstanding lifelong contribution to political reporting and public discourse across Canada, and in recent years with a particular focus on our own community. His distinguished career has touched upon virtually every role within the publishing industry including political journalist, columnist, editor, publisher, biographer and, most recently, professor of journalism and politics focusing on the media.

Throughout his work, Geoff was not merely a witness to Canada's most important stories and events, but helped Canadians better understand their political world.

His life began in London, Ontario. He attended Ridley College and the University of Western Ontario before beginning his journalism career, covering the federal political scene for Canada's national newspaper, the *Globe and Mail*. From 1965 through 1968, the period of Lester Pearson and John Diefenbaker, he was the *Globe's* parliamentary correspondent and he covered the rise of Pierre Trudeau from House of Commons newcomer to prime minister of Canada. After serving for a year as the *Globe's* Queen's Park bureau chief he left the paper and returned to Ottawa, serving three years as *Time Magazine's* Ottawa correspondent.

In 1973, he began an eight-year stint as the *Globe and Mail*'s Ottawa columnist and associate editor. This required a daily column six days a week, whereas today it is unusual to see columnists producing more than two or three pieces a week. This era marked the rise of the Parti Quebecois and the Quebec referendum. It also featured the only defeat of Pierre Trudeau and the brief rule of Joe Clark as Conservative prime minister. That government came to an end on a want-of-confidence motion proposed by another member of today's platform, Bob Rae, who was then a young MP from Toronto.

Geoff served as national editor for the *Globe* between 1981 and 1982. He then combined his pursuit of reporting with his love of sports and became the *Globe*'s sports editor. It might be noted that during his term the *Globe* won the National Newspaper Award for sports coverage, an honour it has failed to again win in the 25 years since he left that position. Between 1983 and 1989 he was the managing editor of the *Globe and Mail*. Throughout this period he witnessed and reported on the repatriation of Canada's constitution and the creation of our Charter of Rights and Freedoms. This period included Pierre Trudeau's famous walk in the snow, John Turner's leadership run and ill-fated political comeback, and Brian Mulroney's tenure as prime minister. Between 1989 and 1993 he was the primary political columnist for the *Toronto Star*, *Vancouver Sun* and *Montreal Gazette*.

During this period he also co-founded the *Sun Times* of Canada, a Tampa-area paper for Canadian residents of Florida. This passion for running his own paper led him to move to Florida in 1993 and serve as the paper's editor and publisher. Thankfully for Canadians, he returned to Canada in 1996 and for five years served as the managing editor of *Maclean's* magazine. From 1989-90 and 2001-2004 Geoff served as an adjunct professor of political science at the University of Toronto. When Geoff relocated to Cambridge in 2004, the chair of Laurier's political science department learned of his interest in teaching here and quickly added him to our faculty. Geoff teaches political science on Laurier's main campus and journalism at the Brantford campus and has a teaching load comparable to full-time Laurier faculty. His third- and fourth-year classes are treated to visits by some of Canada's most influential journalists and political practitioners as Geoff draws on his national contacts to make politics a real event for his students.

His assiduous work style continues. Throughout this time Geoff Stevens has written a weekly column for the *Record* and has developed a national reputation as one of Canada's leading biographers. His 2005 biography of Dalton Camp was awarded the Drainie-Taylor prize, and he is currently completing a biography of Flora MacDonald.

He is joined today by his wife, Lin, who works in marketing, and his children Alexandra, Sean, Casey and Jamie. Geoff is an ornament to our university and community and we are lucky to have him with us.


